IS THIS THE GENERATION THAT IS GOING TO WITNESS THE END OF AMERICA?

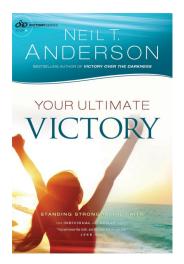

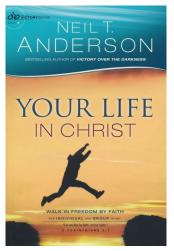

Jesus Fed a Crowd

BIBLE STORY SUMMARY:

- Jesus and His disciples worked hard teaching and healing people.
- They crossed the Sea of Galilee to rest, but the crowds followed them.
- When it got late, the people were hungry.
- Jesus miraculously fed a crowd with five loaves and two fi sh.

BIG PICTURE QUESTION:

• Why did Jesus perform miracles? Jesus performed miracles to glorify God, to show He is the Son of God, and to care for people.

Christ Connection: By feeding the five thousand, Jesus provided for the physical needs of the crowd. The next day, Jesus called Himself the bread of life. (John 6:35) Only Jesus is able to satisfy our souls forever by providing forgiveness, peace with God, and eternal life.

FAMILY DISCUSSION STARTERS:

- How do you think Jesus' disciples felt about the crowd of people?
- How did Jesus feel about the crowd of people?
- How can our souls be satisfied?

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

• Talk to your kids about Jesus' compassion for people. Remind your kids that God often uses us to show His love to others. As you teach kids this Bible story, help them know that God can and will provide for our needs. Kids can trust Him for their "daily bread." (See Matt. 6:11.) God met our greatest need in giving us salvation through Jesus. Will He not graciously give us all things? (Rom. 8:32)

Together as a family, make some homemade cookies, or bread and see if there is someone in your neighborhood or circle of friends that you could deliver it to.

Clean out closets and deliver any toys, clothes, or household items to a compassion center, or Goodwill.

Here are some good tips that I got from an article written by Julie Mason. She is the Head of Content and Curriculum for TeacherVision. She brings an expertise in blended and personalized learning, instructional coaching, and curriculum design to the role.

It's important to have an open and honest conversation with your child about what to expect this upcoming school year, whether they are going back in person, remote learning, or doing some combination of the two. One of the most important things to do before the first day is to establish daily routines and schedules. This might include a check list of daily tasks. If needed, post it on the refrigerator. Start establishing bedtime and morning wake times a few days before school starts. Don't wait until the night before! Make a homework or classwork space for your child in your home. Let them help you create this area and organize it with all the materials that they might need. A

dedicated learning space at home can help nurture your child's creativity, enhance their focus and increase their motivation levels.

If Your Child Is Going Back To School In Person...

If your kids are going back to a classroom, their experience is going to be very different than last year. Most students will wear masks. Students will wash their hands and sanitize their desk and supplies. They won't be able to share with their classmates or be closer than six feet from them. Some students won't leave their classrooms, and will eat lunch at their desk.

Your kids might feel anxious or worried about making a mistake or getting sick. Talk to your kids about how they feel. Empower them with coping mechanisms and strategies, and review safety protocols. If your kids aren't used to wearing masks, talk to them about why it is safe for them and other people if they do. Start wearing masks at home for a little bit at a time so it doesn't feel as new or uncomfortable when it's the first day of school. Before school starts, practice the routine, which will now include masks, hand sanitizer, and keeping distance. Help your child visualize what their experience will be like, which will lower anxiety. Get in the habit of picking out clothes to wear the night before, packing lunches the night before and putting backpacks, jackets, and shoes next to the door ready to go.

If Your Child Is Going Back To School Online and In Person...

If students are going back and forth between their classroom and learning online at home, they might feel confused about the schedule. Some expects suggests that you post a large visible schedule at home and color code it depending on hybrid days vs. at home days. Keep wake up times and bedtime consistent whether kids are going to get on the bus or head to school or not. Expect some pushback from you kids, who may feel that "school rules" don't apply at home. Be patient. Provide positive reinforcement when you see your kids doing well, and be compassionate if they have a setback.

If Your Child Is Doing Online Learning At Home...

Online learning isn't homeschooling. It isn't your job to develop curriculum, plan lessons or take over as your child's teacher. Your job is to help your child adjust to learning online, which means being in partnership with their teacher. If an aspect of online learning isn't working well for your child or your family, reach out to the teacher. Chances are she needs your feedback as this type of teaching is likely new to her. Teachers have thick skin and don't get offended easily.
