In the beginning, the all-powerful, personal God created the universe. This God created human beings in His image to live joyfully in His presence, in humble submission to His gracious authority. But all of us have rebelled against God and, in consequence, must suffer the punishment of our rebellion: physical death and the wrath of God.

Thankfully, God initiated a rescue plan, which began with His choosing the nation of Israel to display His glory in a fallen world. The Bible describes how God acted mightily on Israel's behalf, rescuing His people from slavery and then giving them His holy law. But God's people—like all of us—failed to rightly reflect the glory of God.

Then, in the fullness of time, in the person of Jesus Christ, God Himself came to renew the world and to restore His people. Jesus perfectly obeyed the law given to Israel. Though innocent, He suffered the consequences of human rebellion by His death on a cross. But three days later, God raised Him from the dead.

Now the church of Jesus Christ has been commissioned by God to take the news of Christ's work to the world. Empowered by God's Spirit, the church calls all people everywhere to repent of sin and to trust in Christ alone for our forgiveness. By God's grace in Christ, repentance and faith restores our relationship with God and results in a life of ongoing transformation.

The Bible promises that Jesus Christ will return to this earth as the conquering King. Only those who live in repentant faith in Christ will escape God's judgment and live joyfully in God's presence for all eternity. God's message is the same to all of us: repent and believe, before it is too late. Confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe with your heart that God raised Him from the dead, and you will be saved.



New 10-Week Men's Bible Study begins Wednesday, October 14 at 6:30pm


"Freedom In Christ: A 10-Week Life-Changing Discipleship Course"

I love Autumn! As a teacher, it was one of my favorite times of the year to teach

about the seasons, trees, and leaves. There are so many life lessons that we can learn as we study the science about trees.

As I look out my window into my backyard, I am surrounded by massive oak trees, with branches reaching outward and upward. There is so much beauty in their strength. The deep green leaves of summer that provided shade, will be turning colors of yellow, red, and orange soon, and eventually falling to the ground leaving a tree with empty branches. My heart is always a little sad when that happens. But the bare tree reveals just how big and mighty those branches are, giving a new perspective on its size and purpose.

So, what can we learn from these big oak trees, and how can we use this to help teach our children and grandchildren about God's creation?

First of all, these trees remind us of how God can take a little acorn and through years of passing through one season to the next, strengthens it to become a mighty oak. Each of these seasons are producing the roots, trunk, and branches that give strength for the next season to come. In our live we go

through all kinds of seasons. Some are seasons of hard times, and some are bright, beautiful and fruitful. Each season has its purpose to grow us, like that tree, into the person that God has created us to be. Through each season He is telling us to let go of ourselves, hold on to Him and let Him show us what He can do.

Next, the leaves on the tree can teach us that God uses all things for His purpose in every season of our life. The tiny new leaves unfolding and forming in the spring remind us of hope and renewed growth in our spiritual life. The broad green leaves provide us shade in the summer and refuge to wildlife, reminding us of our Father's protection for us. The beautiful colorful leaves of fall show us the creative beauty of the Creator. Even as they fall to the ground with the acorns, they are fulfilling their purpose to provide nutrients to the soil, which is needed by the tree for growth in the next season. By doing what a leaf was designed to do, it enhances life and gives glory to the Creator. Change is constant in nature, and as the world changes around us, we also change. To truly live, we must embrace change as part of God's purpose to grow us, while looking to God to sustain, strengthen, guide, and comfort us through it all.

Finally, leaves also teach us that all living things must die, but life continues. The leaves and nuts fall to the ground, but the tree remains alive to produce more leaves and carry on the process of life. After we fall to the ground in death, we continue to touch others through our legacy that we leave our loved ones. Through Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior, we live on as we join in the eternal celebration of life.

For every beginning there is an end, and for every ending there is a new beginning. We inherit a legacy, but we also leave one. As you look at the trees and the leaves turning colors, and making their way to the ground, thank God for

the seasons in your life that produce change needed to grow and mature you. Ask God to give you opportunities to share these lessons with the children in your life.

Seasons come and go, but our God remains the same!
