

Should Christian Families Celebrate Halloween?

I found this interesting article by Erin from Lullaby Lark and I wanted to share it with you.

In my opinion, Halloween is an opportunity for teaching our kids about God and how to <u>in</u> the world and not <u>of</u> it. This Pumpkin Prayer Printable is an excellent way to do that! But, whether or not you choose to celebrate the holiday according to our cultural norms (i.e. scary costumes, candy, trick-or-treating, etc...) is totally up to you.

The answer to whether you should use Halloween as an opportunity to teach our kids about Jesus becomes clear when we look at God's heart toward passing his standards to the next generation.

Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. **Impress them on your children.** Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates.

Deuteronomy 6:4-9 NIV

This passage makes God's heart pretty clear. We are to take every opportunity to teach God's word to our children. Halloween can either be an instance that draws them away from God's truth because they desire to be like their friends, or we can teach them how to please God with the way we celebrate.

There's another point I'd like us to consider about Christians and Halloween. Paul writes in his first letter to the church in Corinth:

Be careful, however, that the exercise of your rights does not become a stumbling block to the weak. For if someone with a weak conscience sees you, with all your knowledge, eating in an idol's temple, won't that person be emboldened to eat what is sacrificed to idols? So this weak brother or sister, for whom Christ died, is destroyed by your knowledge. When you sin against them in this way and wound their weak conscience, you sin against Christ. Therefore, if what I eat causes my brother or sister to fall into sin, I will never eat meat again, so that I will not cause them to fall."

1 Corinthians 11:9-13 NIV

In our efforts to use every opportunity to teach our kids about God on Halloween, we cannot forget that we must also consider other believers. This passage tells us that, even though we have knowledge—that we should be teaching our kids about God every day, even on Halloween—our Christian brothers and sisters may not understand what we are doing. So, we must be careful to celebrate in a way that is above reproach and brings honor to Christ and his church. And, if we hear that what we are doing is causing another believer to sin (not be annoyed, irritated, or to think that what we're doing is wrong) then we should absolutely stop what we're doing.

This is a good idea that you can use with your kids and grandkids if you decide to carve a pumpkin this week.
