In the beginning, the all-powerful, personal God created the universe. This God created human beings in His image to live joyfully in His presence, in humble submission to His gracious authority. But all of us have rebelled against God and, in consequence, must suffer the punishment of our rebellion: physical death and the wrath of God.

Thankfully, God initiated a rescue plan, which began with His choosing the nation of Israel to display His glory in a fallen world. The Bible describes how God acted mightily on Israel's behalf, rescuing His people from slavery and then giving them His holy law. But God's people—like all of us—failed to rightly reflect the glory of God.

Then, in the fullness of time, in the person of Jesus Christ, God Himself came to renew the world and to restore His people. Jesus perfectly obeyed the law given to Israel. Though innocent, He suffered the consequences of human rebellion by His death on a cross. But three days later, God raised Him from the dead.

Now the church of Jesus Christ has been commissioned by God to take the news of Christ's work to the world. Empowered by God's Spirit, the church calls all people everywhere to repent of sin and to trust in Christ alone for our forgiveness. By God's grace in Christ, repentance and faith restores our relationship with God and results in a life of ongoing transformation.

The Bible promises that Jesus Christ will return to this earth as the conquering King. Only those who live in repentant faith in Christ will escape God's judgment and live joyfully in God's presence for all eternity. God's message is the same to all of us: repent and believe, before it is too late. Confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe with your heart that God raised Him from the dead, and you will be saved.



Some of the areas we will cover in the course include:


· how we became brand-new people from the inside out when

GRATITUDE PRACTICE IS EASY, HEARTWARMING AND FUN TO DO HERE ARE SOME IDEAS

Looking for a great way to help kids slow down and think about all the things they can be grateful for?

Here's the perfect mindfulness activity for Thanksgiving or a rainy day. It's called the

gratitude tree. I love the chance to count my blessings, and it's a fun activity to do with your child or grandchild.

The gratitude tree activity teaches children to:

appreciate the small things in life, be grateful for everything they have, be mindful of the things that are going right in their lives and the people they hold closest to their hearts.

It even comes with <u>science-backed benefits</u>. <u>According to research</u>, <u>gratitude practice</u> decreases stress and negative thinking as it increases happiness and social intelligence. How about that? You can go from spending your day wallowing in negative thoughts to actually immersing yourself in life's joys. This might all sound a little lofty, but it's true. There is so much good in each day, but we are usually just too distracted to see it.

Spend some time talking about gratitude with your child or grandchild and think about all the blessings in your lives. Tell your kids about lessons your parents taught you that you are grateful for today. See if it becomes a new family tradition in your home.

Here's another fun activity that encourages children to notice people and things to be thankful for. It's called **GRATITUDE SCAVENGER HUNT.**Print or write out the list below. As you drive around or while you go about your day check off the things you observe.

Then go through the list and invite all family members to display and talk about what and whom they are thankful for and why.

- 1. Find something outside you enjoy looking at.
- 2. Find something that is useful for you.
- 3. Find something that is your favorite color.

- 4. Find something you know someone else will enjoy.
- 5. Find something that makes you happy.
- 6. Find something that tastes good.
- 7. Find something that smells amazing.
- 8. Find something that you can't live without.
- 9. Find something that makes you feel safe
- 10. Find something that makes a beautiful sound.
- 11. Find someone you are grateful for.
- 12. Find something that makes you laugh.



Start a Family Gratitude Jar

Have a conversation about gratitude. Model by sharing something you're grateful for, and explain why you have gratitude for that particular thing. Stress the importance of showing gratitude for non-material items (instead, model by showing your gratitude for another person, opportunity or experience). Write your gratitude sentence on an index card or small piece of paper. After you've shown him what to do, tell the child it's his turn.

If he needs assistance writing, help by giving him a sentence starter. For example, you can write something such as, "Today, I'm

grateful for ______." and have him fill in the blank. Place the note in the Family Gratitude Jar and watch the gratitude jar fill up over the month of November. Bring the full jar to Thanksgiving dinner and read the cards out loud—it's fun to lay all the cards out and revisit each one as a family.

To help him put it into practice, ask your child to try recall three things he is thankful for the next time he is sad, afraid or angry. Ask him to notice how thinking about those things makes him feel. Are those thoughts comforting? It's likely he'll say yes.
