Ravensbruck was known as one of the worst German concentration camps during World War II. When Corrie ten Boom and her sister Betsie

found themselves imprisoned there, they were disgusted to discover that their barracks were infested with fleas. When Corrie began to complain, Betsie insisted that they instead give thanks, quoting I Thessalonians 5:18, "In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you." With some persuasion, Corrie finally joined her sister in thanking God for the fleas.

Several months later, the two sisters expressed their surprise that the camp guards had never come back to their barracks to disrupt or prevent the evening Bible studies they held for their fellow prisoners. It was then that Corrie realized that the very fleas which she had so despised had actually been a God-sent protection from the cruel guards.

This illustration is what we might call, "a blessing in disguise." Sometimes, unanswered prayers are actually gifts from God. Many times, we think we know best, but the truth is, our good, good Father knows what is the very best! Here is what we know for sure – God wants us to give thanks in every thing. Notice, it doesn't say that we give thanks <u>for</u> everything, as some things are evil in this fallen world. But we can rejoice and give thanks <u>in</u> everything, because the same God who never fails will not fail us now!

May you be blessed beyond measure this Thanksgiving – and remember to give thanks in every thing!



God would not allow David to build the temple because David had killed so many people during all the wars he fought. God wanted a man of peace to build His temple, not a man of war. God would allow David's son Solomon to build the temple instead (1 Chron. 22:6-10).

This must have been disappointing to David, but it did not mean that his story was over or that he could no longer serve and honor God. Instead, David could continue to honor God in other ways. David honored God through his hard work preparing for the temple.
