



### **Newsletter December 3**

Imagine if you suddenly lost the ability to speak. That would cause many problems!

In our lesson this week, Zechariah did not have to imagine losing his voice—it was his reality. When Zechariah did not believe the angel and the news that Zechariah would have a son, he was unable to speak until his son was born. This must have been very challenging and frustrating! When Zechariah obeyed and named his son John, his voice returned.

Zechariah's silence is a reminder that we can trust God. When God says He will do something, we can trust Him to do it, no matter how difficult or incredible.

This lesson is also a reminder that we should always obey and follow God's plan. There may be times in life when we want other things, and there may even be times when following God is difficult, but we can trust that God's plan is always best.

Thank God, for always being faithful. Ask Him to help us trust Him at all times, even when it is difficult. And to give us strength to obey and follow Him when we don't understand.

"His name is John." Suddenly Zechariah could speak again and he said these things about John, "He will be called a prophet of the Most High. He will go before the Lord to prepare a way for Him. He will help people understand salvation through the forgiveness of

their sins." Then Zechariah made this promise about Jesus. "Because God is merciful and compassionate, the dawn from on high will come to us. He will shine on those who live in darkness and the shadow of death. He will guide our feet into the way of peace." Luke 1:57-80

# Winter 2021-22 Sunday School Study: Ezekiel and Daniel

Each of these books emphasizes the sovereignty of God and the hope He provides for those who are faithful to Him. The prophecies of Ezekiel underscore the dangers of rejecting God; but they also remind us that He is always at work, bringing life and redemption to His people in their most difficult times. Daniel records narratives that highlight the power of faithfulness, along with a series of apocalyptic dreams that reveal God's sovereign control over nations and events—past present, and future.
