How do you celebrate Christmas if you are not feeling the festiveness of the season? What are some simple, practical things you can do if you are feeling down in the

dumps at this time of year? I write this because there are many who struggle this time of year. For some, it is certainly NOT the "most wonderful time of the year."

First, remember who loved you first and loves you most. You have a friend in Jesus. He is a friend that will stick closer to you than a brother (or sister!) When He went to the cross to suffer for the sins of the world, you were on His mind! What a friend we have in Jesus! He doesn't just call us servants – He calls us His friends! You are not alone – you have a BFF in Jesus!

Second, count your many blessings. Focus on what you have, not on what you have lost. Focus on God's promises like **Romans 8:37-38**, "neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." Fill your heart and mind with illuminating truth from God's Word. God's Word is the light that dispels the darkness.

Thirdly, remember this phrase. "it came to pass." Depression and sorrow don't come to stay – they come to pass. The writer of **Psalm 42:5** says: "Why are you downcast, O my soul? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise Him, my Savior and my God." David wrote in **Psalm 30:5b**: "Weeping may remain for a night, but rejoicing comes in the morning." King David certainly battled depression, but he worked hard not to stay there by getting his praise on and remembering, "this too shall pass."

Finally, find a way to bless someone else. A great way to get your mind off your problems is to get your mind on someone else's need. Find a need and meet it. Pray for people. Send an encouraging message. Pray, "Lord, make me a channel of blessing today!" Serving God by serving and loving others is a great way to dispel the blues. I love you all,


In a practical sense, how do I give myself to Christ?
