


FRIENDSHIP GOOD NEWS December 31, 2020

In the beginning, the all-powerful, personal God created the universe. This God created human beings in His image to live joyfully in His presence, in humble submission to His gracious authority. But all of us have rebelled against God and, in consequence, must suffer the punishment of our rebellion: physical death and the wrath of God.

Thankfully, God initiated a rescue plan, which began with His choosing the nation of Israel to display His glory in a fallen world. The Bible describes how God acted mightily on Israel's behalf, rescuing His people from slavery and then giving them His holy law. But God's people—like all of us—failed to rightly reflect the glory of God.

Then, in the fullness of time, in the person of Jesus Christ, God Himself came to renew the world and to restore His people. Jesus perfectly obeyed the law given to Israel. Though innocent, He suffered the consequences of human rebellion by His death on a cross. But three days later, God raised Him from the dead.

Now the church of Jesus Christ has been commissioned by God to take the news of Christ's work to the world. Empowered by God's Spirit, the church calls all people everywhere to repent of sin and to trust in Christ alone for our forgiveness. By God's grace in Christ, repentance and faith restores our relationship with God and results in a life of ongoing transformation.

The Bible promises that Jesus Christ will return to this earth as the conquering King. Only those who live in repentant faith in Christ will escape God's judgment and live joyfully in God's presence for all eternity. God's message is the same to all of us: repent and believe, before it is too late. Confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe with your heart that God raised Him from the dead, and you will be saved.


Friendship K.I.D.s Korner News



As we look toward the start of the new year, why not consider a family devotional Bible that will help you and your kids have a consistent "**Read Through the Bible**" plan for 2021. I was blessed to grow up as part of a family who believed in reading the Bible in family devotion times. Some of us know firsthand how important those times can be. Others of us, struggle with *knowing* its important, to actually doing it.

So how do you help your kids stay in God's Word? Check out the following things you can do to help teach kids to have a daily time with God:

- 1. Pray and ask God to be with your time in His Word and invite God to speak to you through you study.
- 2. Model to kids how to have a quiet time with God. Have a quiet time together so that a child will understand.
- 3. Treat the Bible with respect as you handle and carry it, affirming its trustworthiness, authority, and reliability.
- 4. Read a passage out loud together.
- 5. Ask kids what they think the passage means.
- 6. Memorize important verses.



- 8. Respond to God in prayer.
- 9. Journal about the things you are learning and God's answers to your prayers.
- 10. Thank God for answering your prayer.

Notice how this movement starts and ends with prayer and opening yourself to God speaking and your taking action. What great lessons for our kids! It is even better to take this journey together and read the same passages and talk about them together.

<u>Foundations for Kids</u> is one example of a great tool that helps parents teach their kids God's Word. Not only does it provide a 260-day reading plan (5 days per week for one year). This plan helps parents and kids go through this study together: reading God's Word, memorizing Scripture, understanding and applying Bible truths, and responding to God in prayer.
