I was just thinking ... about how many times I have watched the movie The Ten Commandments starring Charlton Heston as Moses and Yul Brenner as the Pharaoh. I believe it still comes on around Easter time. For those who have not seen it, it is one of the first "epic movies!" It is both large and long. In 1956 Cecil B. DeMille produced the almost 4 hour movie that is a syncretism of many Biblical stories but focused on the Exodus. The stories are not always accurately portrayed but it is/was an interesting movie. I cannot think of Moses without seeing Charlton Heston!!

In 2007 there was a new movie called The Ten Commandments that was produced starring Dougray Scott as Moses and Omar Sharif as his father-in-law, Jethro. It has not met with nearly the fame or the following of the first. It is another long movie, almost 3 hours in length, but it portrays a different, more earthy interpretation of Moses and the Exodus. It suggests that the Israelites had to become warriors and explores the struggle of enforcing the Law so that there wasn't anarchy. It shows the man Moses struggle with following God and leading the people.

Have you considered what it meant for the people of Israel to leave slavery after many years and learn to become a people? The comfort of being kept is at times more desirable than the promise of freedom. At times the comfort of our sin is more compelling than the freedom to follow Christ in obedience to God. I invite you to think about how we have been freed from sin and offered a new life in Christ. How do we live together? Is there a need for a moral understanding or common law?

The Exodus is a large part of the Story of God. It is not one that has only happened long ago, it is one that we are still in the midst of today.

I am glad to be on the journey with you!
