Purpose:

It is our desire to partner with parents in the spiritual upbringing of their children. Our focus is to share God's word with children through Bible verses and stories. With the Holy Spirit guiding us, we hope to help children develop a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and begin to build a solid Christian foundation for their life.

How Children's Ministry supports the vision of our church:

Children's Ministry provides opportunities for children to *receive* Christ-centered teaching rooted in the Word of God. The children will have opportunities to *respond* in worship during Children's Church, Kingdom Kids and Vacation Bible School. They will also *renew* their personal relationship with God thru these ministries. It is our hope that our children will *release* their faith by sharing it with others.

Committee Focus:

To design and implement Biblically centered programs for the children of our church and community. These programs enable children to grow in their knowledge and understanding of the Bible. Our committee focuses on children birth through fifth grade and sixth grade Confirmation; helping them build a strong Christian foundation.

Accomplishments in 2020:


Circumstances related to the pandemic presented unique challenges to maintaining the purpose and focus of Lighthouse Children's Ministry. However, the director and volunteers used creativity and available resources to continue to provide opportunities for children and families to remain engaged in their Spiritual growth.

- * Children's Church continued use of the GO! curriculum which covers the Bible in a year and focuses on Christ-centered learning activities. Online videos for each week were developed for families to use at home while unable to attend in person.
- * New Children's Church volunteers were raised up and trained.
- * Any fifth Sunday in a month is dedicated to family worship. This allows families the opportunity to worship together, and create meaningful discussion about the service.
- * Confirmation for 6th graders serves as the capstone of Children's Ministry and a transition to involvement in Youth Group. Eleven 6th grade youth were Confirmed in 2020.
- * Nursery provides childcare for worship services various and special church functions. In addition to volunteers, paid, trained workers have been hired to staff the Nursery.

- * Prior to the pandemic, Lighthouse hosted a spring session of Kingdom Kids with a renewed emphasis on family worship.
- * A Virtual Vacation Bible School provided activities and lessons for children and families to do at home during the pandemic.
- * All second graders were presented with their own Bible.
- * At Christmas, families participated in Dough Holy Night, a devotional activity completed in the home where families got to "eat cookies and praise Jesus." The event partnered with the Generosity Team to collect money for My Father's House. We were able to provide Christmas gifts for two families and present a generous cash donation.

What we hope to accomplish in 2021:

- * Continue to provide gospel-centered learning activities that help children understand the Big Bible Story.
- * Provide families with resources, education, and training to support discipleship in the home.
- * Continue to grow our community outreach programs including Vacation Bible School and Kingdom Kids.
- * Provide children with 5 minute Biblically centered lessons in the nursery.
- * Utilize the Harbor for current programs such as Kingdom Kids and upcoming events.
- * Continue to support children and their families through challenging circumstances.
- * Ensure every child 2nd thru 5th grade has a Bible.
- * Help children understand they are a valued partner in our church.


Youth Ministry

General direction of this ministry: During 2020, we placed an emphasis on prayer that we had never done before, as well as started to fast together somewhat regularly. We started Care Team Deliveries beginning in April thru Dec. (minus Nov.) Our hearts wanted to connect with those who were more isolated than normal due to covid. In these "Love Bags" we shared everything from homemade cinnamon rolls (thank you Barb Daley) to most months a full lunch with breakfast casserole and fruit for Easter. We tucked in a fun item and always shared a devotional we hoped would be encouraging. Thank you to Terry Robinson for all her leadership and time to head up our care deliveries. To make this happen we thank additional people outside of Deacons who assisted. A special thank you to Keith Robinson, Aidan Bridgman, Darla Jenkins, Terry & Ruthie Gillen, Susie Atkins, and Tammy Dowd.

Fellowship – We are thrilled looking back that we were able to have our Valentine Dinner-around 170 enjoyed the evening and the Variety Show. No other fellowship times were able to happen in 2020. We do look forward to some point in 2021 where we can have fellowships – perhaps utilizing the great time following worship for visiting and a cookie or perhaps outdoor events. We will put our creative thinking hats on!

Response – Do you know we have Deacons in place to help when there is a need? Areas we help with include minor home maintenance and yard work. Please call the church office (294-2400) when we might be of assistance to you or another church family member. Dino Motta and Brian Walters were amazing! – helping in various ways to many! A thank you to Janet Rhea & Edie Hewitt for their commitment in sending out cards to church family for various occasions and to Tauna Connell for filling in.

Also under Response is:

Care Home Visitation: After March it was not possible to visit in person. A thank you to Tauna Connell and Rebecca Sutton for providing printed devotions every month the rest of the year. Tauna made individual book holders for "Our Daily Bread" devotions provided by PACA. A special thank you to Ashleigh Sutton for making homemade Christmas cards for residents.

Meals: We try to be aware of needs of those who have been hospitalized or other areas of need. We welcome each of you to let us know when we can bless you in this way.

Community: Deacons also shared with the community. Special seasonal care bags were given to those patients who go to dialysis at DaVita here in Paola. Thank you to Pam Bryant who suggested Lighthouse Church bless them. We shared Valentine, Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas care bags with devotions and other fun meaningful items. With the help of Lisa Weidman, the outside windows at DaVita were professionally cleaned. Kay Ufford and Rebecca put window/ Christmas clings on the inside windows. It was very meaningful to share the love of Christ with them.

Community Care - Pastor's Discretionary Fund

Purpose: To assist those in need in our church family and community. This is part of the mission of LPC and falls under the area of Release.

Church Staff Resource: Rebecca Sutton and Pastor Kirk Johnston

The Pastor's Discretionary Fund is a special fund within the church with gifts given by individuals and ministries earmarked specifically for helping others in need within the Paola zip code area. Gifts are placed in a restricted fund. It is not a budgeted line item.



The total amount of **gifts given in 2020: \$19,076.03 We Praise God** for all the gifts by individuals, ministries and memorials to share the love of Christ from Lighthouse Church. Thank you to those who make regular personal gifts. You may give a gift at any time during the year made payable to Lighthouse Church with "Pastor's Discretionary" in the memo.

We have not been as busy with requests from the community in the last several months. With ECKAN receiving special covid grants, they have been taking a lot of the load. PACA also pays up to \$200.00 a year for rent as well as utilities during this covid time. I feel Lighthouse will receive a lot of requests in the spring of 2021. Thank you to Erin & Tracey in the Office for assisting in requests.

In 2020 we assisted with: utilities, rent, Dr.'s appointments, prescriptions (never approve pain or control prescriptions), gas for medical appointments or to go to a job interview; car insurance/tags, car repair, diapers, formula, food (when food banks aren't open) motel stays or camp site rent for homeless individuals. In 2019 & 2020 we have seen an increase of homeless people needing camp site rent or small tents. We thank the Tuesday morning Bible Study group for making up toiletry and snack bags to give to people/families. Christmas gift cards were also given to a few families. We never give cash and always write a check to the specific area of need. We continue to see needs of the elderly increase so have blessed them in various ways and have been a link for them for other resources as well.

The total amount of gifts we shared in 2020: \$6,996.72.

We take very seriously our role in the "over and above" stewardship gifts that have been given to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund. We keep individual files on all we have helped. We try to build relationships with all we meet – many times people call for new prayers or asking for other resources. We decline people when we do not see a real need or they do not have a realistic, sustainable plan going forward. We have specific contact people with propane companies, city utilities, Evergy and Kansas Gas Service. We also are in frequent touch with the Salvation Army, ECKAN, and PACA to coordinate funds and requests. We always try to partner with another agency when possible. We see an importance in the area of mental health and put a priority on trying to help clients from Elizabeth Layton Center when ELC personnel call with a request – and also with MCMC and Miami County Jail. We also use community resource people for advice and feedback.

This is an ongoing Ministry and we begin 2021 continuing to share Christ's love with others and showing our church's personal love and concern in the name of Jesus to those in our community. Thank you so much for supporting this Ministry with your prayers and your gifts!

The Personnel Committee acts as the Human Resources Department for Lighthouse Church. They monitor compliance with requirements and work with the E.P.C. to provide benefits for Lighthouse staff. They work with staff to write policy guidelines with the goal of protecting staff and individuals attending Lighthouse events. The Personnel Committee writes and updates job descriptions and participates in the interview process.

2020 presented the Personnel Committee with many challenges, most of which were due to Covid-19 Pandemic. We were presented with many questions on how to pay and support our staff from March through the end of the year. During the stay-at-home order, our church continued to pay our staff thanks to funds received from the government Paycheck Protection Program (PPP). These funds were also utilized anytime a staff member had to quarantine due to Covid-19 exposure or sickness. We made it through most of the year without a staff member being sick with Covid-19. The end of November and into December we had 3 staff members contract the virus and that led the church to close for a few days. We consider ourselves truly fortunate to not have had a severe outbreak amongst our staff. The staff has been very diligent to follow CDC guidelines on sanitizing and mask wearing when in close contact. We feel these measures helped keep exposure and risk low. We are very grateful to all of our staff for persevering through this very challenging year!

Another item we worked on in 2020 was pursuing a new company to do background checks for our church staff and volunteers. Our previous provider was related to our church and they were giving us a price break, however we felt that the number of background checks we were needing was too much to ask of them. The Personnel Committee decided to engage with a new company in order to begin a process of more frequent and exhaustive background checks. This company is called C4 Operations Background Check Services. We feel this change in our church background check process is a good step to help keep all church staff, volunteers, youth and children safe.

The rest of 2020 we had several items that are typical for our church Personnel Committee to address through-out the year. One of those is our Annual Reviews of all paid staff positions. The Personnel Committee has the blessing of having an awesome staff to review each year!

We thank all our Lighthouse church family for supporting and helping our church staff during 2020! We also thank all staff for being so flexible and understanding during such a challenging and difficult year!

The Finance Committee monitors monthly income & expenses, coordinates the annual stewardship campaign, and prepares the annual budget. Ministry committees submit budget requests for their ministry areas. Budget requests are evaluated in conjunction with pledged/non-pledging giving to develop an operating budget.

The 2020 year ended with a surplus. While giving was slightly below budget, expenses were notably under budget, resulting in the surplus. Following is the year end 2020 summary of giving and expenses (subject to slight changes due to final year end expenses and adjustments):

Pastoral salaries were reduced in the 2020 budget. Due to the year-end surplus, reductions of \$4,620.87 for Pastor Kirk and \$3,695.50 for Pastor Brad were reinstated (\$8,316.37 total). Pastor Kirk declined his amount and directed it to be used for Uganda housing support and COVID bonuses for church staff. This will be reflected in the January 2021 expenses.
