## The Great Blondin

I have heard the true story of the Great Blondin since before I became a Christian, and it still delivers.

Charles Blondin, born *Jean François Gravelet*, lived from 1824 – 1897, and was a French tightrope walker and acrobat. He called himself **The Great Blondin**, and was best known for walking across the Niagara Falls Gorge on a tightrope. Yes, a *tightrope* – a rope made entirely of hemp and only two inches in diameter. It's roughly 1,100 feet from one side to the other.

If that's not impressive enough, he performed the same feat:

- Over 300 times
- With his body in shackles
- Backwards
- Running
- At night, carrying the headlight from a locomotive
- With a sackcloth over his head so he could not see
- Carrying a camera (and taking a photograph of people watching)
- Carrying a stove (and made an omelet in the middle, then ate it...the omelet, I mean)
- On stilts!

So when he pushed a wheelbarrow from the Canadian side to the American side of the falls, no one was particularly surprised. He asked them, "Do you

believe that the Great Blondin can put a man in this wheelbarrow and push him across the falls?" The crowd was electric with anticipation: "We believe!"

"OK", said the acrobat, "who will get in?" And the crowd went silent.

In our Sunday morning Bible study group, called *First Watch*, we have been studying, reflecting on, and discussing the nature of faith in relation to the eleventh chapter of Hebrews: *Now faith means putting our full confidence in the things we hope for, it means being certain of things we cannot see. It was this kind of faith that won their reputation for the saints of old (Heb.11:1-2 JB Phillips).* 

One of the men in our group, Dave, pointed out that he had never been to the continents of Africa, Asia or Europe, but he has faith that they are real, that they actually exist. Right. I have never actually seen my brain, but I'm certain it's in my head (no comments, please).

Real faith – a faith based on facts, based in reality, moves a person to take some kind of action – like the saints of old referred to in Hebrews. That kind of faith in God moved Abraham to leave his homeland, Moses to stand

up to the king of Egypt, David to battle the giant Goliath. As the singer / songwriter Rich Mullins wrote: Stories like that make a boy grow bold / stories like that make a man walk straight.

Like the story about Blondin.

Incredibly, after several pensive moments, a man stepped forward and said that he would get in that wheelbarrow. And the Great Blondin pushed him back and forth.

It's one thing to stand in a crowd, yelling with a bunch of other people, *We believe!* 

But a biblical faith – the kind of faith the saints of old were commended for in this chapter – that kind of faith means stepping out from the crowd…and actually

climbing into the wheel barrow. The man who did that put his faith into practice.

Are you still standing in the crowd, cheering, shouting, watching? Or will you step out from the crowd and climb into the wheelbarrow?

Combine your tiny mustard seed of faith with the massive and overwhelming promises, goodness and faithfulness of God. He will guide you over the roiling waters of life both in the here-and-now, and even more so in the life to come.



#### Our Vision

To grow in Christ and become like Him. We seek to teach and demonstrate the gospel each time we gather with children. We pray they may be light in their world and that their light may grow brighter each day with the help of the Holy Spirit. We also dedicate ourselves to supporting the family unit as primary teachers of the faith and the conduit through which God shows His love and reveals His character.

#### What We Offer

Nursery (0-3) - Nursery is available during worship each Sunday morning and for some special events (dates and additional information will be provided as needed). Our focus is to provide loving care for our youngest children and age appropriate activities introducing them to the God who loves them.

Children's Church (Preschool-5<sup>th</sup> grade) – Children's Church is offered during worship each Sunday. At a designated time during the service (usually following a children's message), children are dismissed to the back of the sanctuary to meet their adult leaders. Children may be picked up in the children's educational wing following the close of worship. Each week children learn about the Big Bible Story through creative storytelling and extension activities. On months with a 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday, children remain in worship.

Family Night & Kingdom Kids (all ages) – Two times a year, fall and spring, a midweek program is offered on Wednesday evenings that includes a meal, worship, and Bible-based activities for all ages. Dates, times, and other necessary information will be provided in the weeks prior to each session.

Vacation Bible School (Preschool – 5<sup>th</sup> grade) – Each summer a Vacation Bible School program is offered. Dates and other information regarding VBS will be provided in the Spring.
