The season of *Lent*, the 40 days that precede **Easter**, can be a time of deep, personal reflection before the Light of God's Word and Holy Spirit.

In the Bible the number "40" is important. God's flooding rain of judgment fell on the earth 40 days and nights as Noah and his family took shelter in the Ark. The Israelites, by their disobedience, were forced to wander 40 years before their children could enter the Promised Land. Jesus fasted 40 days and 40 nights before his temptation by Satan.

Thus "40" can represent a period of **preparation** or **repentance**, **judgment** and **cleansing**. Traditionally, we Christians have used the season of *Lent* as a time of spiritual pilgrimage, asking God's Spirit to reveal to us how we are doing in

our new life with Christ. Are we becoming more like Him or less? Are their areas of rebellion, a spirit of unforgiveness or idolatry in us? Have we become softer or more hard to the life of Christ? Do our lives display the Love of God and neighbor? Are we more generous and more led by Christ's Spirit or have we fallen backwards toward things of the flesh? (Gal. 5:16-26)

How you ask these questions and seek God's presence are varied but could include, personal worship, prayer, fasting, service, giving, contemplation and repentance. You may find God calling you to lay some idol down at his feet. You may find yourself called to take up a task or a new calling. (Look inside for a nice reminder that Lent should be more than what we stop doing) Seek the face of God in honesty and sincerity and you will find need and refreshment.

We began the season with Ash Wednesday services on the 2nd. We used **ashes** as a sign of sorrow and repentance as well as an admission of our mortality; that from dust we were made and to dust we will

return. It is sobering to remember much of what we adore, strive for, fuss and fight about will one day, again be ashes – but our Spirits will live forever. Often, the best way to understand the triumph of Easter in Christ is to walk a path of preparation and repentance; remembering, that by the work of Christ, we are promised beauty from ashes (Isaiah 61).

Galatians 5: ¹³ You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love. ¹⁴ For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself." ¹⁵ If you bite and devour each other, watch out or you will be destroyed by each other. ¹⁶ So I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. ¹⁷ For the flesh desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the flesh. They are in conflict with each other, so that you are not to do whatever you want.

Sunday, April 10: Palm Sunday
