Make a sunflower, which turns its head to follow the sun.

What you need:

- Paper plate
- Yellow marker
- Scissors
- Yarn (black and brown)

What you do:

- 1. Color the entire plate yellow.
- 2. Around the edge, cut out an odd number of triangles. Evenly space the cuts to form flower petals.
- 3. Poke a hole in the plate's center. String black yarn through the hole and over one triangle cut. Tie a knot at the back of the plate.
- 4. Continue looping yarn through the hole and over the remaining cuts. Secure the end. The flower should look like a wagon wheel with black spokes.
- Tie the brown yarn to a black "spoke." Weave the brown yarn over and under the spokes in a circle. Continue until the sunflower has a large center. Then tie the end.
- 6. Display your craft as a reminder to follow the Son, Jesus!

I (Pastor Brad) have been posting some devotions, scriptures and thoughts on our Lighthouse Facebook Page since the pandemic began in March 2020. You can find them here. Or, beginning with this current issue, you can read some of them on this page of the Beacon. Hope God blesses you through them.

A Good Question Makes You Think

My favorite question in the Bible: Why do you look *for the living among the dead?* (Luke 24:5)

It's such a good question on so many levels:

- 1. It's a fair question. Jesus taught his followers, including these women, that he would be handed over to the Romans, he would be put to death, and then he would be raised on the third day. He said this to them numerous times. So why are you looking for him here? This is a graveyard.
- 2. It's a provocative question. The angel made them think; he made them question their own suppositions: Hmmm...well of course Jesus would still be dead, and we need to take good care of his body, and, well, where else would he be? (Add a roll of the eyes and a *Duh?* here.) Angel: Nope. Time to re-think your thinking.
- 3. It's a gentle question. In other words, it's not terribly confrontational. Compare the angel's question posed to these women to Jesus' rebuke of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus in Luke 24:25: How foolish you are, and how slow to believe all that the

prophets have spoken! Ouch. I'm grateful for the gentle question, but honestly feel like, more often than not, I belong in the foolish and slow to believe group. I think the angel knew that the women were quite ready to believe the good news.

4. It's a leading question. You know, the kind that prosecutors and defense lawyers get in trouble for asking the witness in every courtroom scene, ever: Objection, your honor! The defense is leading the witness! Except it's a really good thing here: the angel is leading them to discover the stunning reality of the resurrection. Did you seriously think he would be here?


- 5. It's a simple question. Nothing too obtuse or complicated here. Straight to the point: your Lord is not dead at all, so the graveyard thing is history. Sure, he was here, but you need to move along with your search; here's a hint for you: right now, you're cold.
- 6. It's a stark question. Living vs. Dead. Only in the zombie movies do these two co-exist. The angel had to have caught their attention immediately. What does he mean by living? We watched him

die a horrific death. Must have taken their collective breath away. Wonder what it was like once they had processed his question...although...

7. It's a rhetorical question. Didn't need an answer. Not from the women. Truth is that the angel didn't really give them time to answer; just followed up quickly with the best news they had ever heard: He is not here; he is risen!

Leave it to the Lord to ask these faithful (to the bitter end) women a multilayered question. A question that had no intention of shaming them, but rather helped them cut to the heart of

the matter, move past their initial shock and return to their group to let the men know. Yes, those men: the ones who would not believe them and were on the receiving end of some shaming from Jesus for their collective doubt – but that's another story.



Another good question: What is your favorite question in the Bible and why?

Our Vision

To grow in Christ and become like Him. We seek to teach and demonstrate the gospel each time we gather with children. We pray they may be light in their world and that their light may grow brighter each day with the help of the Holy Spirit. We also dedicate ourselves to supporting the family unit as primary teachers of the faith and the conduit through which God shows His love and reveals His character.

What We Offer

Nursery (0-3) - Nursery is available during worship each Sunday morning and for some special events (dates and additional information will be provided as needed). Our focus is to provide loving care for our youngest children and age appropriate activities introducing them to the God who loves them.

Children's Church (Preschool-5th grade) – Children's Church is offered during worship each Sunday. At a designated time during the service (usually following a children's message), children are dismissed to the back of the sanctuary to meet their adult leaders. Children may be picked up in the children's educational wing following the close of worship. Each week children learn about the Big Bible Story through creative storytelling and extension activities. On months with a 5th Sunday, children remain in worship.

Family Night & Kingdom Kids (all ages) – Two times a year, fall and spring, a midweek program is offered on Wednesday evenings that includes a meal, worship, and Bible-based activities for all ages. Dates, times, and other necessary information will be provided in the weeks prior to each session.

Vacation Bible School (Preschool – 5th grade) – Each summer a Vacation Bible School program is offered. Dates and other information regarding VBS will be provided in the Spring.
