

There will be a container near the entryway where you may place your items. Care Kit assembly will be Thursday, July 15th, 9:30am at Lighthouse Church. You are invited to help.





I (Pastor Brad) have been posting some devotions, scriptures and thoughts on our Lighthouse Facebook Page since the pandemic began in March 2020. You can find them <u>here</u>. Fighting for All You Are Worth

In his book, <u>Leadership Axioms</u>, under the chapter heading: What life are you waiting for? Bill Hybels tells the following story about **Joni Erickson Tada**. If you are not familiar with Joni, Google her name to learn the amazing story of this woman who, though paralyzed from a diving accident and confined to a wheelchair, continues to use her gifts to bless countless people for the Lord.

Many years ago I shared a conference stage with Joni Erickson Tada. She did a Q&A session following one of her talks, and someone in the audience asked her how she kept going – how she kept leading and serving and creating – despite her obvious physical challenges.

I'll remember her answer for a long time. She said, "This is the only time in history when I get to fight for God. This is the only part of my eternal story when I am actually in the battle. Once I die, I'll be in celebration mode in a glorified body in a whole different set of circumstances. But this is my limited window of opportunity, and I'going to fight the good fight for all I'm worth."

Powerful words from a woman with obvious challenges. But the same is true for you and me.

Each of us have our share of limits, liabilities and challenges, but we also have gifts, strengths and abilities. How have you / are you / will you use any and all of these strengths and weaknesses to advance God's kingdom here on earth – in your limited window of opportunity – while you are *in the battle*?

Or are you just waiting for a different life?

Paul was blessed with all kinds of advantages during his formative years. As was Moses. But their stories teach us that these advantages are not worth leaning on. Not when God is calling you to something greater. Something that lasts.

Hebrews 11:24-26: By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be known as the son of Phar-

aoh's daughter. He chose to be mistreated along with the people of God rather than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a short time. He regarded disgrace for the sake of Christ as of greater value than the treasures of Egypt, because he was looking ahead to his reward.

Disgrace for Christ held greater value than the treasures of Egypt??? Sounds wonky. Backwards. Upside down. Counter-cultural. And real.

And something worth living for.

Paul chose to boast in his weaknesses, rather than his strengths: But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the

more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. ¹⁰ That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong. (2 Corinthians 12:9-10)

Like Joni. Like Moses. Like Paul. Let us also admit and embrace both our weaknesses and our strengths, that we might find his grace both sufficient to comfort us in our trials, and empowering to compel us to fight the good fight while we have a heartbeat and breath in our bodies.
