Howdy Camper!

We are so glad you want to come to Camp WHOA! You will have the opportunity to learn how to care for a horse and spend time riding horses. You will be learning about similarities between your relationship with horses and your relationship with God. Lessons will be learned through Bible study, riding and caring for horses, chores, crafts, games, recreational activities, and more! Care will be given to encourage you to explore your relationship with your Lord and Savior and leave camp with great memories and a desire to seek and share the Lord with others!

Camp WHOA will be held at Laclede Baptist Camp which is located off of Highway T, approximately 2.2 miles from the junction of Highway T and Interstate 44 (Exit 140) near Stoutland, MO. Look for a big sign on a pole located at the gravel road (Swallow Drive) just off of Highway T. Then follow the signs down to the camp entrance. The Laclede Baptist Camp amenities include a chapel, dining hall, storm shelter, craft building, swimming pool, volleyball and basketball court, basketball field, Gasconade river overlook and multiple cabins with bunk beds, large bathrooms, and air conditioning.

What to bring to camp! (make sure your name is on all your belongings)

- **Twin sheet set, blanket or sleeping bag and pillow plus sleepwear and bathrobe.**
- **A basket or tote bag to carry towel, wash cloths, soap, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, and hairbrush/comb back and froth from bunkhouse to shower/bath area.**
- **It will be hot, so dress appropriately but conservatively for outdoor activities.**
For riding: we recommend wearing jeans, t-shirt and boots (no open-toe shoes).
Note: helmets will be provided and will be expected to be worn!
- **A light weight jacket or sweater for possible cool mornings and evenings.**
- **A large bag to bring all those dirty clothes home!**
- **A Bible and pencils for Bible study.**
- **We ask that you DO NOT bring snacks.**
- **For swimming: a modest bathing suit, flip flops (concrete will be hot!) and an extra towel. Oil-free sunscreen ONLY.**
- **Leave cell phones, MP3 players, jewelry, gaming equipment (Ipad, Ipods, Nintendo DS, etc.) at home please! No tobacco products, alcohol, drugs weapons, pocket knives, or pornography will be allowed on campgrounds.**
- **Do not bring spending money. However, we will be collecting a mission offering.**
