Unity Amid Diversity

I've gladly and thankfully served the Lord at LCOS for nearly 47 years. There's never been a year in which the church family has fully agreed on everything, beginning with the decision to issue a Divine Call to me!

First issue several months after the Call was a proposal to change the time of the services. In 1975, the first service & Sunday School were concurrently at 9:30am. A second service was held at 10:45am, but the latter service consisted of only a handful of Sunday School teachers, their families, and not many others. Sparse attendance suggested a change might better serve the Lord and the church family's spiritual life. The proposal was to have worship at 8:30 and I Iam with Sunday School & Sunday School and Adult Education from 9:45 to 10:45am. The resolution passed but not without disagreeable pushback.

It's a blessing all around that the Lord's nature is to love and save all people, including those disagreeing with each other. We're a church family because the Lord in the power of the Holy Spirit calls us together.

Most of the time (but not always because pastors are human beings too) the church family's diverse opinions excite me. Once upon a time I was conflictadverse. No more. I've grown in my faith and learned of the Lord from members whose faith experiences, ideas, and opinions are different than my own. Sometimes radically different.

On June Sundays, we read from Saint Paul's 2nd letter to the Corinthians Christians, hearing pleas to unify. Wowsa! The apostle writes to a divided, bitterly fractured assembly. Paul appeals neither to common sense nor pragmatic institutional survival. He appeals to the Lord and the Holy Spirit, trusting Jesus and the Spirit can change anyone and everyone. No one is impermeable to the gospel changing hearts, minds and souls from intractability to a unity amid diversity grounded in the Lord's salvific work for all.

Jesus died and lives for *all*. The Church is the Body of Christ of *all* and for *all*. There's a rich diversity in the *all*. Let us recognize and celebrate the Lord's presence in one another!

The Votes Are In...

...and the revised Constitution has passed! The Congregational Meetings, held on June 20 and 27, were well attended. A special thank-you goes out to Renee Wicklund, who in her role as Vice President of the New York Metropolitan Synod, gave a short presentation on the importance

of the constitutional changes and some background as to how these changes align with the greater expressions of the "Church", specifically the ECLA and the NY Metropolitan Synod. Council Member Bob Carpentier, Esq. was instrumental in guiding the Church Council throughout

this process and is also deserving of our thanks! And, a BIG thank you to all who were able to attend in person to bring this monumental task to a successful conclusion.

Happy 38th Anniversary to Andrew's parents, Dawn & Steve Preston, that was celebrated on June 18th.




