#### Rooted in Christ

Do you know Jesus? Is he a part of your everyday life? It can be difficult to look at our lives and realize we are not as connected to Jesus as we want to be. However, when we DO make efforts to incorporate God's Word into our life, it changes the lens by which we view the world. Paul writes to the Colossians a word of encouragement and a caution. **Colossians 2:6-8 says:** 

"Therefore, as you received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving. See to it that no one takes you captive by philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the world, and not according to Christ."

We live in a remarkable time and are blessed to have the modern comforts we enjoy daily. I recently heard a podcast talking about fallen civilizations. They focused on the people of Sumer (southern Mesopotamia or southern Iraq). This region is considered one of the birthplaces of modern civilization. These people existed (6,500 BC) and built an incredible community, yet their nation rose and fell, in part because of water. They had cultivated crops using water that had salt in it, which over time ruined their food source in the desert. Now the ruins of these megacities lay abandoned in the desert.

My question is... where did they come from? Scripture talks about the world forming post-flood (**Genesis 10-11**). These people from Noah, set out and multiply, formed nations, and as humans do... fell away from God. Yet, we see Abraham comes from this region of Sumer (Ur) and is called to Canaan (or Israel today) (**Gen. 12**). We trace the lineage from Abraham to the birth of Jesus. A child born to a virgin, in the tiny town of Bethlehem, who lives a quiet life up to age 30. Jesus begins a 3 year ministry, teaching his disciples, performs miracles, dies, is buried and is resurrected. He sends out his 12 apostles to tell others about this middle eastern man who boldly claims to be the Savior of the world.

We are the end result of that ministry... some Lutheran Christians living in a small town in western Kansas. We are part of a story that is WAY bigger than us. God has moved thru history, constantly at work to care for his chosen people and to continue his message of love, forgiveness, grace, and salvation. Just like people of old, nations will rise, cities will fall, people will live their life, but if we allow this big world to separate us from Christ, then we too will fall and be lost to the sands of history. However, like the birth of Jesus, a new thing has happened... thru the pure water of baptism we are called into an eternal family and held securely in the hands of the God of all creation. How precious we are to Him. Faith is a miracle He works in us, may we stay grounded in that faith... today and always. Thankful for the Word of God & His Love ~ DCE Ben





We had a lot of exciting things happen in November for Operation Christmas Child (OCC).

Midweek and Church Wide Shoebox Packing parties where we packed 768 shoeboxes.

A Prayer Walk around the church in preparation for National Collection Week.

There were 22 volunteers who worked 126 hours receiving, packing, loading and transporting shoeboxes.

A Prayer over the shoeboxes and truck as we transported them to Oakley.

Messiah Lutheran Church received a total of 2,129 boxes.

There was an actual total of **2,527** Collected shoeboxes here in Hays, these boxes will now allow for **2,527 Gospel Opportunities for children around the world!** 

While the work at Messiah for Operation Christmas Child is wrapping up the journey of the shoeboxes will continue into December and all year long.
