Mark 1:14-20 ¹⁴ Jesus came into Galilee, proclaiming the gospel of God, ¹⁵ and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel." ¹⁶ Passing alongside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew the brother of Simon casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. ¹⁷ And Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men." ¹⁸ And immediately they left their nets and followed him. ¹⁹ And going on a little farther, he saw James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, who were in their boat mending the nets. ²⁰ And immediately he called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired servants and followed him.

Jesus called you in your baptism from a life of self-serving sin to a life lived at the foot of His cross. As we live our lives Satan continually tempts you with the garden of earthly delights. As I read these words from the Gospel of Mark I see two questions for you to reflect upon.

An Empty Table

When you sit to eat, who do you eat with? Do you gather with parents, your spouse, your children? Or do you sit with friends, perhaps strangers? Or are you in a rush and you eat on the run? A few years ago, my family moved our big dining table from the basement to the upstairs. Our small table was not allowing us to eat together as a family. Studies prove that there are immense benefits to eating together as a family. So daily, we gather around the table and give thanks to God for all that He has provided for us. It has been a joy to eat together as a family.

The tables we gather around are important. The people at our tables indicate value, time, and love. We value the people we invite to our tables, as we spend our precious time with those individuals. Whom we invite shows the love we have for those around us, especially since we don't often invite strangers to our table. It is at the table however that relationships are built and it is there that we are fed and nourished physically, emotionally, and yes, even spiritually.

Have you ever heard of a man named Mephibosheth? Yes, that is a mouth full, but he was the only surviving son of Jonathan, the dear friend of King David. Take a moment and **read 2 Samuel 9.** King Saul and his family fall out of God's graces and into disgrace. At the death of King Saul & Jonathan, they went from the top of the kingdom to the bottom. David becomes the new king and out of love, reaches out to the crippled Mephibosheth. David in compassion restores all of Mephibosheth's inheritance, gives him servants, a home, and property. Most importantly, the king gives Mephibosheth a place at his table for the rest of his life.

Being invited to sit at the king's table is an incredible honor and one that most of us can't imagine. As sinners, we truly don't deserve to sit at the table. As Mephibosheth said, "What is your servant, that you should show regard for a dead dog such as I?" Amazingly, we too approach our Lord Jesus as "dead dogs" and yet weekly we are invited into the Lord's house to dine at his table. At the Lord's Supper, we too are restored, forgiven, and lifted up. We walk away feeling alive again and give thanks to God for his grace and mercy.

Who are you showing mercy to? Who do you share a table with? I pray that you find great JOY in gathering around the Lord's table.

Members have donated their time and talents throughout the year through a variety of activities.

One such activity that has become a major one for the group is the annual Ground Hawg Feed held each year in early February in conjunction with Ground Hog Day (and sometimes the Super Bowl). Last year we had a lesser amount donated, but we still found a way to disburse \$800 of our funds to the following organizations.

We donated:

- \$500 to the LLL Kansas District Project (for pastors in training at seminaries and other projects in Kansas)
- \$200 to Lutheran Hour Ministries (for Lutheran mission work at home in the U.S. and around the world)
- \$50 to Messiah LYF
- \$50 to Messiah CIA

Orphan Grain Train received the benefits of the remaining Thrivent funds

We hope that this coming year's Ground Hawg Feed will be an even bigger success matching those prior to 2019.

We are planning our event for this year and we need everybody's participation. We don't know what it will look like this year, but it will be different.

The Noble Men of Messiah's Annual Ground Hog Feed is happening this February!

This is our big fundraiser in support of the Kansas District Project of LLL, Orphan Grain Train and of course our own youth groups.

Things are MUCH different this year. Because of Covid-19, we will not do this event in the same way as we have in the past.

- We will hold the event on a Saturday, February 27, starting at 9 AM and going through noon to perhaps 1 PM.
- The menu will be strictly takeout with our famous sausage patties, scrambled eggs and pancakes only in Styrofoam serving containers.
- On that day, we will setup pick up lanes in the parking lot and delivery to households unable to come.
- We will be asking \$8 a meal for adults and \$4 each child under 10.
- We will be asking households to sign up for a meal beforehand so we know how much to cook.
- Of course, free-will donations of more than the cost will be gladly accepted.

Persons will be able to buy uncooked sausage also.

I just wanted to thank you so much for your recent gift. This year, as all of you have experienced, has been a challenge for us at Dream. As you know, for the first time in 30 years, we could not hold camp due to covid-19. We had waited on that decision until late May and had continued to receive some registrations and inquiries of sending kids to camp – but due to what was transpiring and not wanting to place the kids or staff in harms way – we cancelled the camps. The referral sources were supportive of this and they too, did not feel they could send kids to camp.

We have assured the kids and referral sources that were wanting to send kids – that those children have first spots available for camps this summer. I have one little boy that will have just turned 12 (our cut off is 11) – but I told his grandmother – we would go ahead and let him come this summer.

Our hope is to have two camps so... please, please, please pray, that covid allows us to do that. My thoughts right now are that if school is still being held at the end of May, camps will be a go.

On our treatment end (although your funds go directly for camps), my staff and I worked tirelessly through the rough portion of covid from mid-March-July – providing seamless services for our clients by calling them for treatment sessions literally from 8a.m. – 9p.m. each day/night so that providing treatment was seamless with no interruptions.

Thank you for your continued support – I cannot tell you how important that is – but also for your prayers.

Community Rewards from Dillons

Then once you sign into your Dillons Account, in Dillons Community Rewards, you search for your organization—It will have you click on "here" to pick an organization. You choose—Messiah Lutheran Church, Hays KS, then hit SAVE—and you will start earning dollars for Messiah!

It is easy to do, only takes a few minutes, but the rewards are great!

So Come on -Sign up if you haven't already—ONCE YOU SIGN UP, it will remain with your account indefinitely, unless you make a change in your organization.
