

# **Some Christmas Reflections**

Christmas is the season of the "The mystery of the Word made flesh." But, this mystery is one that centers not around the question "How can this be?" – which is what the Blessed Virgin wondered out loud when told she was with Child – but lies rather

in the answer which was given to her in her wondering by the archangel, Gabriel. This is what he said:

"The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you; therefore, also, that Holy One who is to

be born will be called the Son of God. Now indeed, Elizabeth your relative has also conceived a son in her old age; and this is now the sixth month for her who was called barren. For with God nothing will be impossible." St. Luke 1.35-37

So then, the "mystery of the

Word made flesh" isn't a mystery concerning the manner in which Christ Jesus was born of Mary – that issue has been settled quite clearly and for all time in the angel's words to the Virgin – namely that the Christ would be conceived by the

God decide to send His Son into this world bearing the flesh of man? Why did God determine that in order to save us His Son would have to live as we do (but without sin), suffer in our place, and then endure the hellish death we rightly deserve? Why was it

> that God felt this was the only way in which He could grant lus His grace, His life, His mercy, His forgiveness – and ultimately, His eternal salvation? That, you see, is "the

see, is "the mystery of the Word made flesh" – not how it happened but that it happened at all – that God our Father continues to have mercy on us in spite of our desire not to heed His Word, live by His commands, worship Him as He desires, or love others as He requires – that He chooses not



Holy Spirit in her womb, and that He would then be born into this world the very same way as all other babies are born.

The mystery, then, is not "how" this all happened, but instead, "why?" Why did the Lord God choose this way of rescuing us from sin and death? Why did

simply to forgive us as we forgive others (with a quick "that's okay"), but rather that He chooses to locate His forgiveness, His righteousness and His

compassion in the flesh His Son received from being born into this world in the womb of the Virgin – that's the mystery.

Thankfully, Our Lord God doesn't require us to understand or figure this mystery out before He

gives us its benefits. He doesn't even demand that we believe it before He offers it to us. When He determines it best, Our Lord God simply "sends forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law, to redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the adoption as sons. And because we are sons. God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, crying out, 'Abba, Father!' Therefore we are no longer slaves but sons, and if sons, then heirs of God through Christ." (Galatians 4.4-7)

Faith, then, simply believes that this is all true. Faith simply receives the gift Our Lord Jesus gives and is. Faith might be curious about some of the details of this mystery, but in its curiosity faith doesn't demand a full explanation before it believes. Faith simply rejoices that, for whatever reason, Our Lord God has had mercy upon us and has chosen to extend His mercy and

blessing to us in this way. For "as many as receive Our Lord God in the flesh, to them He gives the right to become children of God—that is, to those who believe in His name." (John 1.13)

In the same fashion, the faithful Christian will also desire to re-

ceive for him or herself the "mystery of the Word made flesh" only through those means by which God the Father chooses to give it – in the Gospel and in the Sacraments. Holy Baptism, Holy Absolution, the Blessed Sacra-

ment of Christ's Body and Blood, the Divine Liturgy, and the preaching of the Gospel – these are the places where God has promised that "the mystery of the Word made flesh" will become real for you – and where the True Gift of Christmas is to be given to

you.

To not attend Christ's Holy Mass – that is, the Sacrament of His body and blood – or to put

it another way – to shrink from every opportunity God gives you to hear and receive the blessings of your faith – is tantamount to denying yourself the opportunity to benefit from the blessings Christ has already won for and presented to you. Consider this: if a person were to be given a large inheritance but then refused to make use of it, most would likely conclude that that person might be crazy. So also, those who refuse to partake of the Lord's Supper or hear the Holy Gospel are likewise refusing to receive Our Lord Jesus as He comes to us for our good in His Body and His Blood - His medicine of immortality for sinful souls.

And that brings us to another mystery, doesn't it – the mystery of why any Christian would not want to receive that which has already been accomplished for us – and is even now Sacra-

mentally present for our good in the suf-

fering and death of our Savior.

My encouragement to you therefore during this Advent/

Christmas season, is that you receive, partake of, and rejoice in "the mystery of the Word made flesh" at every opportunity. That happens whenever you

attend the Divine Service – whenever you hear Christ's Holy Absolution, and whenever

you taste the Sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood. At Trinity, God has given you a great many opportunities to receive and participate in "the
mystery of the Word made flesh."  Don't make
light of them or let them pass you by because you may be more involved in preparing for your family Christ-
mas than you are in celebrating the True Meaning of the Sea- son. Instead, take advantage of the many occasions you have
before you to receive the gifts Christ desires for you (especially in the weekly Advent Services, which will be
held each Wednesday evening at 7:00 PM, on Christmas Eve at 7:00 PM, Christmas Day at 10:00 AM, and then on Sunday, the 29th at
the regular time, 9:00 AM). There is where you'll not only hear about, but commune in "the mystery of the Word made flesh." God's peace be with you
as you joyfully celebrate the birth of and receive our Lord during this joyful Christmas season. God bless Pastor


