# The Joy of Church

**Note:** This was from last month's Newsletter which was posted only on the Website, and after looking at the statistics from the website it appears that only a half dozen or so actually saw it, so I'm putting it in this month's Newsletter as well . . . Enjoy.

The true beauty of the Holy Bible is that it is literally teeming with iovous, paradoxical truths: God is Three in One. God is Man. God dies on a cross. The God who visits His vengeance upon trespassers has mercy only on upon sinners. You and I, we both die to live and we live to die. We Christians are at the same time both saint and sinner – both righteous and holy, yet so unholy that apart from Christ we cannot stand before God and live. The weak are mighty and the mighty are weak. Afflictions are really nothing more than blessings in disguise. The word of man is at the same time the very Word of God. The poor are rich, and the rich are poor. The first are last and the last are first. Law and Gospel work together to save us from our sins by killing and making alive.

Now it is a hallmark of Lutheranism that we Lutherans do not, as a matter of principle, try to resolve these paradoxes placed before us in God's Word. We don't try to answer the question as to whether what we receive in the Lord's Supper is bread or body, wine or blood, for the Biblical texts simply state that it is both. If salvation is God's act alone, faith is a result of eternal election to salva-


The maladies in the life of the twenty-first century Church, and in the Church of every age for that matter, are the result of missing "the narrow way" (Matthew 7:13-14). It is a paradox itself, that the "high" road of orthodoxy – right teaching and right praise – is absolutely freeing! For ortho-dox-y

is both right doc-trine and

right dox-ology (or praise) – with "ortho" meaning straight, right, or proper, as in orthodontia, which means "straight teeth." So also orthodoxy leaves plenty of room for us to rejoice in all the God-pleasing differences of gifts, emphases, and even personalities that exist within the Church.

Even the Church herself is a paradox. She is the

Bride of Christ, "spotless,"
"holy," and "washed" (Ephesians 5:25-27), the "pillar and foundation of truth" (I Timothy 3:15), and the body of Christ (I Corinthians 12:1ff). And yet at the very same time she only appears in this world hidden under the guise of poor sinners, flawed leaders, tension, division, and yes, sometimes even false teaching. This is at once both disturbing and comforting. It is disturbing because at



tion (Ephesians 1), and God wants all sinners to be saved, then why are all not saved? Must not God then, from eternity, also have determined that He would condemn as well as save some? No, this cannot be (in spite of how it looks), for the Bible also says that "God wants all to be saved" (I Timothy 2:4). And since it is an axiom that God cannot lie, then we Lutherans simply let the paradox stand!

times we even find ourselves in such "spotted" congregation, denominations, and Christendom. It is comforting because – despite its outward appearance, despite the fact that there have been times in the history of the Church when the pure teaching of the Gospel all but disappeared from the public confession of the Church and its practice – nevertheless, we still have our Lord's promise that the gates of hell shall not prevail against it" (Matthew 16:18).

So, the Church endures because Christ Himself endures and will never fail in His work of bringing sinners into the Kingdom. Our Lord Christ will never allow His Gospel to go un-believed until the end of time – until that time when all those who will believe have believed, and then will come the end. That's Good News worth rejoicing over, especially in the perilous, crazy times in which we now live.

The secret of living a Good News life in this bad news world is in knowing that despite our manifold weaknesses, our sins and our rebellion against Christ and His Church, Christ will remains wherever, so far and so long as, His Word is proclaimed and heard, and to the extent that true Baptism and the Lord's Supper remain. That is the expansive joy of generous, faithful Lutheranism. Thus genuine Lutheranism is simply nothing more nor anything less than genuine Christianity, and Christianity, with all its manifold weaknesses and sins, is far broader than genuine Lutheranism.

That's the joy of a generous, faithful Lutheranism. It is generous in recognizing the Church wherever the Gospel is proclaimed faithfully and the Sacraments are distributed

according to Christ's institution, and is faithful in recognizing its sacred duty to always be faithful to the truth of God's Word. It may be a paradox, but it's a joyful paradox, nonetheless.
