

Words for Verse #2

Saint <u>Francis</u> was born a rich, noble young man, but God had in mind a much different plan; so <u>Francis</u> left status and money behind, to help <u>many</u> people God's true will to find.

- △ The Sanctus Bell rings three times calling us to worship.
- Processional Hymn #390 The Hymnal 1982 "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty, the King of creation"

The procession will include the six participants who carry the various creation signs. As they reach the front of the nave, they will arrange themselves around the altar pace in a semi-circle facing the congregation.

• THE OPENING CEREMONY¹

Leader Let us celebrate the presence of God in creation. Let

us celebrate sun, moon and stars, wind and air, water, fire, earth, and call them our brothers and sisters, as

Francis did in living a life of praise to God.

Voice 1 All praise be yours, Lord, through all that you have

made. Through Brother Sun, who brings the day.

All He shows your beauty.

Here the "sun sign" is elevated and moved from side to side for emphasis. One or more tambourines are also shaken to highlight and complement this action.

Voice 2 All praise be yours, Lord,

through Sister Moon and Stars.

All In the heavens you have made them bright and fair.

Here the "moon & stars sign" is elevated and moved from side to side for emphasis. One or more glockenspiels are played to highlight and complement this action.

Voice 3 All praise be yours, Lord,

through Brother Wind and Air.

All In stormy or fair weather, we cherish all that you have made.

Here the "wind & air sign" is elevated and moved from side to side for emphasis. One or more soprano recorders are played to highlight and compliment this action.

Voice 4 All praise be yours, Lord, through Sister Water.

All She is useful, humble, precious and pure.

Here the "water sign" is elevated and moved from side to side for emphasis. An aboriginal (Australian) rain stick is played to highlight and complement this action.

Voice 5 All praise be yours, Lord, through Brother Fire.

All Through him, you brighten the sky with his beauty, power, and strength.

Here the "fire sign" is elevated and moved from side to side for emphasis. A small box with a wad of cellophane is crinkled to simulate the sound of burning fire.

Voice 6 All praise be yours, Lord,

through Sister Earth, our mother.

All Through her you give us various fruits, colored flowers, and herbs.

Here the "earth sign" is elevated and moved from side to side for emphasis. One or more hand drums are also played to highlight and complement this action.

Leader Together we proclaim your glory:

All Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

Here all the signs are elevated and moved from side to side for emphasis. Every complementary instrument is also played; but they stop, when the organ begins the introduction to the following hymn. During the singing the sign bearers and instrumentalists are seated.

Celebrant Let us pray.

We give you thanks, most gracious God, for the beauty of land, sea, and sky; for the richness of mountains, plains, and rivers; for the songs of birds and the loveliness of flowers. We praise you for this good earth, and pray that we may keep it safe for our children; and, for the children of *their* children. Help us grow in understanding and gratitude for your remarkable creation; and may our care for all your creatures here below, honor and glorify your Name, now and for ever. *Amen.*

The congregation may be seated.

- SCRIPTURE, STORY, AND SONG
- The Lesson: Genesis 1:1-3, 24-31a [Good News Bible]
- 1st Reader A reading from the Book of Genesis.
 - ¹ In the beginning, when God created the universe,² the earth was formless and desolate. The raging ocean that covered everything was engulfed in total darkness, and the Spirit of God was moving over the water.³ Then God commanded, "Let there be light;" and light appeared.
 - Then God commanded, "Let the earth produce all kinds of animal life: domestic and wild, large and small" – and it was done.²⁵ So God made them all, and he was pleased with what he saw.
 - Then God said, "And now we will make human beings; they will be like us and resemble us. They will have power over the fish, the birds, and all animals, domestic and wild, large and small." ²⁷So God created human beings, making them to be like himself. He created them male and female, ²⁸ blessed them, and said, "Have many children, so that your descendants will live all over the earth and bring it under their control. I am putting you in charge of the fish, the birds, and all the wild animals. ²⁹ I have provided all kinds of grain and all kinds of fruit for you to eat; ³⁰ but for all the wild animals and for all the birds I have provided grass and leafy plants for food" and it was done. ³¹ God looked at everything he had made, and he was very pleased. Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

- 1st Reader We will read the psalm responsively. Your part is in **BOLD.**
 - ¹O Lord, my God, how great you are! *

 You are clothed with majesty and glory;

 you cover yourself with light.
 - ²You have spread out the heavens like a tent* and built your home on the waters above.
 - ³You use the clouds as your chariot*

 and ride on the wings of the wind.
 - You use the winds as your messengers and flashes of lightning as your servants.
 - ¹⁰ You make springs flow in the valleys, and rivers run between the hills.
 - 11 They provide water for the wild animals;*
 there the wild donkeys quench their thirst.
 - ¹² In the trees near by,*
 - the birds make their nests and sing.
 - ¹³ From the sky you send rain on the hills, and the earth is filled with your blessings.
 - You make grass grow for the cattle and plants for us to use, so that we can grow our crops
 - olive oil to make us cheerful, and bread to give us strength.
 - Lord, you have made so many things!

The Epistle: Romans 8:18-23 [The Message]

2nd Reader A reading from Paul's letter to the Romans

¹⁸⁻²¹I don't think there's any comparison between the present hard times and the coming good times. The created world itself can hardly wait for what's coming next. Everything in creation is being more or less held back. God reins it in until both creation and all the creatures are ready and can be released at the same moment into the glorious times ahead. Meanwhile, the joyful anticipation deepens.

²²⁻²⁵All around us we observe a pregnant creation. The difficult times of pain throughout the world are simply birth pangs. But it's not only around us; it's within us. The Spirit of God is arousing us within. We're also feeling the birth pangs. These sterile and barren bodies of ours are yearning for full deliverance. That is why waiting does not diminish us, any more than waiting diminishes a pregnant mother. We are enlarged in the waiting. We, of course, don't see what is enlarging us. But the longer we wait, the larger we become, and the more joyful our expectancy. *Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people*.
