Dear Fellow Redeemed.

Rev. Dr. Lee Hagan, the Missouri District President, shares this devotion with us today. In the light of Reformation Day, remember that God has made you free to serve. God bless your day.

Martin Luther's doctrine of vocation emphasizes the Scriptural teaching that every Christian is called by God to a life of service. Some may be called to lives of service as pastors or teachers, while others serve their neighbors as accountants or police officers. However, each is a form of service that we offer in Christ's name. This key teaching of Lutheran doctrine gives purpose to the daily work that each Christian undertakes. In his "Freedom of a Christian," Luther writes, "A Christian is an utterly free man, lord of all, subject to none. A Christian is an utterly dutiful man, servant of all, subject to all."

We are, therefore, free to serve the Lord with gifts of music and art or by picking up trash around the church grounds. All forms of service are considered acceptable sacrifices to God on account of Jesus—the one, perfect sacrifice. For our service to Christ and His Church is sanctified by the Word of God and prayer.

How is God using you to serve others and be His chosen instrument of blessing? There are so many different ways that we can serve with the gifts that God has given us. As St. Paul writes, "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." (Colossians 3:17) Jesus Christ has set you free to serve! May our heavenly Father use you to be a blessing to many with the gifts that He has given to you! God's blessings in your service!

**A Blessed Reformation Day Eve!** On the Eve of All Saint's Day (October 31<sup>st</sup>) Martin Luther nailed the 95 theses (95 statements of biblical discrepancies concerning the Roman Church) on the Castle Church door in Wittenberg, Germany.
