We encourage current or future giving in any amount, because each gift is important. We urge pastors to engage in life-enhancing conversations about parishioners' hopes and intentions. When you don't ask, you usually don't receive.

But Jesus says, "Ask and you shall receive ...knock and the door will be opened to you."
