





From Your Director of Missions

In 2 Peter 3, verses 8 and 9 Peter wrote: "But, beloved, be not ignorant of this one thing, that one day *is* with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance.

We should learn from scripture that God has His own timetable for doing His work on earth.

In Ezekiel 26, God pronounces His judgement on the city of Tyrus. I believe that He is lovingly and patiently waiting, giving us the opportunity to bring more people to salvation through His Son. How many people do you know that need to come to salvation before God says, "Time is up"?


