



No Bake Sugar-Free Low Carb Peppermint Cheesecake Pie

Crust

- 2 cups sunflower seeds or almond meal
- ⅓ cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 4 tablespoon butter softened
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ¼ cup Swerve sweetener

Filling

- 16 ounces cream cheese room temp
- 1 teaspoon peppermint liquid stevia
- 1 teaspoon peppermint extract
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- 1 cup heavy cream

Topping

- ½ cup heavy cream
- ½ teaspoon peppermint liquid stevia
- ¼ teaspoon peppermint extract

Optional Topping

• ½ cup sugar-free candy canes crushed

INSTRUCTIONS:

Crust

Prepare the no-bake crust by placing all ingredients into a food processor. Process until the mix is a fine crumb consistency. Taste the crust and add more sweetener, as needed. Spread into a 9 inch pie dish. Set aside.

Filling

Place all filling ingredients, except heavy cream, into a stand mixer and blend on high until smooth. Taste and add more stevia as needed. Pour heavy cream into a new bowl and use an electric mixer to blend on high until all whipped in texture. Fold this whipped cream into the cream cheese filling. Spread this into the pie crust.

Topping

Add all topping ingredients into stand mixer, except crushed candy canes, if using. Blend on high until whipped. Taste and adjust stevia, if needed.

Spread this over the cheesecake filling. Top with crushed peppermints if desired. Refrigerate pie for 3-4 hours or overnight.

From Your Director of Missions

As we celebrate Christmas this year, I would like for you to think about the purpose that God had for sending His Son. Mankind, even those who were practicing religion had lost their way. There were not many that were really seeking after the things of God. Animal sacrifices and money gifts were appeasement rather that really desiring to have a relationship with Him. So, it should not have been a surprise that most of the world missed what happened in Bethlehem.

In our world today, most of the population will miss what we are celebrating. They will give gifts, attend parties, be with their families, and may even attend a Christmas Program at church. But, the message of "Peace on Earth, Good Will to Men" will be missed.

As I was thinking about this article, I remembered back through the years of my life. As Southern Baptist, we have developed or promoted many programs to encourage people to help others understand that God sent a Savior into the world. Most of these programs have come and gone. I attended a WIN training school, CWT, Four Spiritual Laws, The Roman Road, FAITH, How to Share Jesus Without Fear, The Net, Who's Your One, and others that do not come to mind at this time. All of these were good plans but they had a flaw.

Their flaw is that we are depending on people learning a program and following it to reach people. Each of these programs were great for a time and then they faded into the background of our lives. I still use principles of many of them, but how long has it been since we promoted any of them.

The principle of evangelism in simple. God provides salvation to an individual and puts into the heart a desire, through the Holy Spirit, to share His message to others. Paul warns each of us about our ability to quench the Spirit. Programs can never replace the work of the Holy Spirit in the lives of God's people who are willing to serve Him.

How did Jesus know where to go or what to say? The scripture says that God gave Jesus the Spirit without measure and also gives it to us.

That is why He went to Samaria and met the woman at the well. That is why Phillip met the Ethiopian eunuch and used the Old Testament to lead him to Jesus. That is why Paul was in jail in Philippi and a jailer's family was saved.

We return to the Christmas Story. Shepherds listened to the angels, went to Bethlehem and met Jesus. Then in Luke 2: 17, "And when they had seen it, they made known abroad the saying which was told them concerning this child." There was excitement about Jesus!

In the scripture, ignorant and unlearned men shared their experiences of being with Jesus. Could our problem be that we have nothing to share with others because we are not spending time with Jesus?

Remember, He was born, lived a sinless life, and died on the cross for you. Are you walking with Him and sharing His story with others?
