

Creamy Pecan Crunch Grape Salad

Serves: 15-20

You're just 7 ingredients away from this Creamy Pecan Crunch Grape Salad recipe that will be a big hit at office potlucks, BBQ's, holiday dinners & parties!



Ingredients

- 1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup (8 ounces) sour cream
- ⅓ cup sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 2 pounds seedless red grapes
- 2 pounds seedless green grapes
- 4 tablespoons brown sugar
- 5 tablespoons chopped pecans, plus a handful extra for sprinkling on top

- 2. Add grapes and stir to coat.

- 5. Sprinkle with some extra pecans on top and serve.
