

# From Your Director of Missions

We have tried to deliver packets to each of our churches that included all of the information that is needed for our Associational Children's Camp. This camp will be July 23rd-27th at the South Missouri Baptist Assembly in Van Buren. The cost of the week of camp is \$135.00. The association will help any church that has children that want to go to camp but cannot afford the camp fee. If your church, or an individual in your church, is willing to pay one half of the camp fee, the association will scholarship the remaining half.

Church camp for our children is a very important ministry of our associational churches. However, it is suffering because of the declining number of children that are attending. Many times this decline can be traced to lack of promotion by our churches because they cannot get adults to attend as caregivers for their children. I would challenge our churches to consider this a mission trip opportunity. An opportunity to reach unchurched children in your community and strengthen the spiritual lives of children in your church.

Maybe your church would consider paying the way for your caregivers. Another option would be to pay the way of an adult from a sister church to go with your children.

We believe that putting children into a situation at camp where they will be around people that love and care for them can make a lifetime difference in that child's life. They will get to hear and experience that love that God has for them through His Son, Jesus. Bible studies, worship music and preaching, cabin devotions, and being around Christian people can open their minds to the difference that Jesus can make in their lives.

All of our churches can look back into the past and recall children and youth that were saved at camp. We can also remember those that surrendered to some form of ministry at camp. This doesn't have to be a past thing in our churches. God can still change the lives of children and sometimes even the caregivers that go to camp.

### Here's what you can do:

- Pray for those that are leading our camp. (Director, Camp Pastor, Bible Study Leaders, Camp Nurse, Camp Staff, and Caregivers)
- 2. Identify children within your church and in your community that need to be at camp.
- 3. Provide financially so that a lost child can have the opportunity to learn about Jesus and what He did for them.
- 4. Recognize that God may be calling you to be a missionary to serve at camp for just one week.
- 5. Provide transportation for caregivers and children to Van Buren.

What if this was our last opportunity to reach these children? Could we say that we did the best that we could to make sure that every child we knew heard about Jesus because our church loved them and sent them to camp?


