

BEACH SAND

INGREDIENTS:

- 12 OZ PACKAGE VANILLA WAFERS Crushed and divided
- 8 OZ PACKAGE CREAM CHEESE Softened
- ♦ 1/2 CUP POWDERED SUGAR
- 8 OZ CONTAINER FROZEN WHIPPED TOPPING Thawed and divided
- ◆ 2 3.4 OZ PACKAGE INSTANT FRENCH VANILLA PUDDING MIX
- 3 CUPS MILK

DIRECTIONS:

- Place 3/4 of crushed vanilla wafers in the bottom of a clean plastic pail or other serving dish.
- In a bowl, blend cream cheese, powdered sugar and half of whipped topping; set aside
- In a separate bowl whisk together dry pudding mixes and milk for 2 minutes, until thickened
- Add cream cheese mixture to pudding
- Spoon over crushed wafers
- Spoon remaining whipped topping over cream cheese mixture
- Sprinkle with remaining crushed wafers
- Chill until set



From Your Director of Missions

I had an experience on June 18th that I have experienced only one other time in my life. We were delivering food from our pantry to Caruthersville after a rain shower and the sun had come out. After about 45 minutes, I realized that I had not drank enough fluid. I was sweating profusely and my energy level was dropping. Then I had something happen that has never happened before. When carrying a box of food I had a charley horse in my upper left arm.

This experience led to me thinking about what Jesus has said that He would provide for us. In John 4: 14, He said, "But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life." This was a promise that Jesus made to us.

However, many times in our lives we are in the same situation in our spiritual lives that I found myself in my physical experience on that Tuesday. I was dehydrated because we had gotten behind in putting the food together and skipped lunch. Therefore I had not stopped to drink fluid and my body was functioning accordingly.

In our spiritual lives many times we get bogged down with all of the physical activities that are going on in our life and we forget to refresh our spiritual lives with the things that God has provided for us. We are thirsty, not because the water is not there, but because we did not partake of it. We didn't take time to read God's Word. We were too busy to pray. We never stopped and asked our Father what He had in store for us today.

Therefore, we are trying to live a Christian life in our own power and our own strength. When will we learn that it won't work? Satan takes great joy in the struggles of God's people. He puts as many obstacles in our way as he can possibly come up with.

The ability to function as a Child of God comes from God. When we are surrendering to His will and purpose for our life, He will provide the refreshment that we need to keep going.

We are reminded in Psalm 46:10, "Be still, and know that I am God". We can see examples in His Word of the refreshing results of trusting and serving Him. Even in John 4, Jesus said, "I have meat to eat that ye know not of".

So, to be a healthy, functioning Christian we need to guard against becoming spiritual dehydrated.

I would like to personally thank the individuals and churches that sent funds to our South Missouri Baptist Assembly (church camp) to repair the air conditioning units. The units were repaired in time for camp and any extra funds will be used to replace another unit that is on its last leg.

Is your church sending any children to camp July 22-26? Look around your community. Is \$140.00 too much to spend to give a child an opportunity to decide on where they will spend eternity?
