

INGREDIENTS:

SOUTHERN

3 lb yellow squash, sliced
½ C diced Vidalia onion, optional
10.5 oz can cream of chicken soup
1 C mayonnaise
1 egg
8 oz shredded cheddar cheese
1 tsp salt
½ tsp fresh ground black pepper
TOPPING

2 sleeves of Ritz crackers, crushed

SQUASH

CASSEROLE

DIRECTIONS:

1 stick melted butter

Preheat oven to 350°F.

Wash and slice squash into small medallions or dice into smaller pieces if the squash is large. Put squash into a large bowl for mixing with the filling.

In a separate bowl, mix together the soup, mayo, eggs, cheese, onions, salt, and pepper. Pour over squash. Stir until well mixed. Then pour into a casserole dish for baking.

Crush crackers while in "tubes" (I usually wrap them in a dish towel to avoid a mess, and use a rolling pin or meat tenderizer) or place in a resealable plastic bag.

Pour crushed crackers into a bowl. Melt butter in the microwave and stir into crackers until moist.

Drizzle on top of casserole.

Bake at 350°F until bubbly and brown on top (usually 45-50 minutes). Bake for 30 minutes covered. with foil to help prevent crackers from burning.

Then uncover and bake an additional 20 minutes until golden brown on top.

From Your Director of Missions

This past Sunday, I had to opportunity to preach for Bro. John Brown at the Oak Grove Baptist Church. The message that God laid on my heart involved following the map that God lays out for us.

We can begin to do this through the study of His Word. Paul instructs us to "study to show ourselves approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth". For the people of God before the promises of the New Testament, this was the method that they had to meet the approval of God. But even then God knew that man would fail and fall short of His desire for them to have a relationship with Him.

So, in the New Testament, God put His Spirit into all who confess His Son and believe in Him for salvation. This is the doctrine of the "Priesthood of Believers". Every believer has the opportunity to hear and follow God's will and purpose for their lives.

This works a lot like using the Map Quest app on your phone.

To begin you must make a decision about where you want to be. You plan a trip to a location that you are unfamiliar with or may have no clue how to get there.

But, the first step is to enter your current location. As long as we are satisfied with where we are and what we are doing, we will not change. We will stay where we are and keep doing what makes us happy. Each church and individual must look at where they are right now. Is this where you want to be? Is this what you want your future to look like?

Paul says, "This one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, I press forward for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus".

The second step in Map Quest is to put where you want to go. The simple entry should be where God wants me to be. This is true for the church as well as the individual.

When we do this in Map Quest, and choose begin, there is a voice that tells us which direction to go and what turns we need to make to get to our destination. This is how the Holy Spirit wants to work in our lives and the life or our churches. Jesus has promised to go with us to the end of the world. How do we get there? Only by following the direction of the Holy Spirit on a daily basis.

Instead of telling God what we are going to do, we need wake up each day and put into our destination, "Where ever He leads, I will go".

We must not deny the instruction and power of the Holy Spirit in our lives and the lives of our churches. God gave up the Spirit to help us find our way as we live on this planet. If we have lost our way, is it because we are not listening to the "Map Quest" of God?
