





## From your Director of Missions

In Proverbs 6: 6—11 is the pattern for the decline of the church.

Go to the ant, thou sluggard; consider her ways, and be wise: Which having no guide, overseer, or ruler, Provideth her meat in the summer, and gathereth her food in the harvest. How long wilt thou sleep, O sluggard? when wilt thou arise out of thy sleep? Yet a little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to sleep: So shall thy poverty come as one that travelleth, and thy want as an armed man.

The decline of the church will happen when we are satisfied with what we have now and do not make any provision for the future.` The ant looks out and recognized that the harvest is at hand and begins gathering in that harvest. The harvest of the church is the redemption of lost people and their joining together in the fellowship of the church after their rebirth experience. If we do not participate in God's harvest, we will eventually run out of people in our churches. It has happened in other parts of the world and is happening before our very eyes in the United States.

The decline of the church is secured when we fold our hands and expect that the Lord's work will get done by others. A common statement is, "I have done my part and it is time that someone else takes over so I can relax". The writer of Proverbs states that this will lead to poverty. If you read in the book of Revelation you will find a church that claimed that they were rich, but God declared them to be poor. We should never judge a church by the size of the building, how many are attending, or how much money that they have in the bank. The true judgement of a church is how many of the members are following the Great Commission and working toward the advancement of God's Kingdom.

If you stop and watch ants, they are always on the move. They will carry items that seem to be bigger than themselves. They recognize that their efforts are necessary if they are to survive. The church is much like that ant colony. We are trying to survive in a world that is not friendly to Christianity. If even some of us stop our efforts, the entire group may not survive. Solomon says that our poverty will come with the suddenness of a woman in childbirth, many times without warning. If we want the church to survive, we need to consider the ants.

Unfortunately, I am not going to be able to reschedule this meeting as the months of May, June & July are full for me. 
