





# Strawberry Heaven

**SERVINGS 15** 



#### **INGREDIENTS:**

1 angel food cake

1 (16 ounce) container Cool Whip

8 ounces cream cheese

1 cup sugar, divided

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 quart fresh strawberries, sliced

3 tablespoons cornstarch

1 (3 ounce) package strawberry Jell-O gelatin dessert

1 tablespoon lemon juice

1 cup water

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

Combine in medium saucepan 1/2 cup of sugar, cornstarch, Jello, lemon juice, and water.

Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until mixture comes to a boil and thickens.

Set aside to cool slightly.

Stir in sliced strawberries.

Tear angel food cake into 1 inch pieces and toss with 2 cups of the Cool Whip.

Press into 9×13 inch pan (I use glass so you can see the pretty layers).

Set aside.

Combine cream cheese, 1/2 cup remaining sugar, and vanilla in mixer bowl.

Beat until smooth.

Stir in remaining Cool Whip.

Spread evenly over cake layer.

Pour cooled strawberry mixture over cream cheese layer, spreading to cover cake evenly.

Refrigerate 2 to 3 hours before serving.

Note: You may substitute a 16 ounce bag of frozen whole strawberries, thawed and chopped, for the fresh strawberries.

#### From Your Director of Missions

This morning as I was sitting looking at the blank page in front of me, I thought of a question that no one likes to think about. What if this was the last column that I ever wrote? What would I say?

The statement of every Christian should be what the Apostle Paul wrote to Timothy. For I am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure is at hand. I have fought a good fight, I have finished *my* course, I have kept the faith: Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing. 2 Timothy 4: 6-8

Many of us may have fallen into the trap of the world and have a different explanation of your life. Most of the world will end their life by saying "I did it my way". Is this how your friends and neighbors think of you? That you have always lived your life in a way that benefits you and the goals you have for your life. When you reach the end of life will there be anything left except the possessions that you leave to others?

Paul recognized the importance of living his life under the leadership of God through the power and direction of the Holy Spirit. He understood the teachings of Jesus regarding giving your life for the benefit of others. Just as Jesus wept over the city of Jerusalem, Paul stated in Romans 9: 2-3, "That I have great heaviness and continual sorrow in my heart. For I could wish that myself were accursed from Christ for my brethren, my kinsmen according to the flesh: His role in God's plan was to publish the gospel message to the Gentiles. However, in his heart, he had a longing for the salvation of the Jewish people, people of his heritage.

So, as Paul was coming to then end of his ministry, he stayed faithful to God's call and the course that God had laid out for him. He did not know when, but he recognized the reality that if Jesus did not come soon, his ministry and life would come to an end.

Paul knew that God was faithful to him and wanted Timothy and those after Timothy to know the importance of living a life that was on the course that God had for them. They were not to be Paul, but to follow their own path under the leadership of the Holy Spirit. The "True Reward" will not be received in this life but awaits us after we cross the finish line.

So, we go back to the original thought. What if today is it? Are there things that you need to do? Are there things that you need to say? Are there changes that you need to make? Can you confidently say, "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course"?

If there is more to be done, what is it? When do I need to start? We are another day closer to the return of Jesus or our death. One of these events will happen in our life and our work and ministry will be over!
