

### STRAWBORRY FLUFF

(corrected from last months VOICE)

### Ingredients

1 small box strawberry jello 1 cup boiling water

1 cup crushed ice

1 box Instant Vanilla Pudding 4 servings size

20 oz crushed pineapple 4 cups mini marshmallows 8 oz whipped topping thawed 16 oz strawberries chopped

### **Directions:**

- 1. Place jello in a medium bowl. Add boiling water and stir until dissolved.
- 2. Add ice and stir until melted. Place into refrigerator for 10 minutes or until it begins to set.
- 3. Place pineapple in a separate large bowl (do not drain). Add vanilla pudding mix well. Add all remaining ingredients and stir.
- 4. Fold jello into the whipped topping mixture until smooth.
- 5. Cover and refrigerate for at least one hour before serving.

# Strawberry Pie

### Ingredients

- 4 cups fresh strawberries, hulled and thinly sliced
- 3/4 cup confectioners' sugar
- 1 homemade pie crust or store-bought pie crust, pre-baked
- 2 cups whipped cream

### **Directions:**

In a large bowl, add the strawberries and 1/4 cup of the sugar and mix together. Let macerate for at least 30 minutes.

Sprinkle 1/4 cup of the sugar on the bottom of the pie crust and pour the macerated strawberries on top. Pat down, so the berries come just to the edges.

Sprinkle the remaining 1/4 cup sugar on top of the strawberries.

Cover with whipped cream and use a spatula to smooth.

## From Your Director of Missions

At the beginning of each of our Children's Home Board Meetings, we have a devotion led by a board member. I would like to share with you the message of the 2 devotions this month.

The first devotion came from Galatians 6 and verse 9 and focused on the idea of us not becoming weary. Many times in ministry we get beaten down by what seems to be overbearing issues. The task seems hard and victories seem to be few and far between.

Paul wrote to the Galatians, "Let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not". How many times in our life have we fainted? How many of those times have we not seen the victory that was just a few more steps down the road?

Let us accept the challenge of Paul and continue to put our heart into the work of the Lord in all areas of our life. Our work life will be successful if we recognize that our Master is God and not the earthly boss that is over us. Our church life will be successful if we recognize that Jesus died for and owns the church. Our families will be successful if we lead and direct them into the paths that God has for us and them. But, we can't stop short. We must continue to work even when we feel defeated. In due season we will reap the benefits of being faithful servants.

The second devotion built upon the first. It was based on Isaiah 40:30 and 31. Even the youth shall faint and become weary. No one is exempt from becoming weary. Even Jesus experienced this as He walked on the earth. Young and old alike experience the weariness of day to day living and the troubles and cares of this life.

If we depend upon our own abilities, we will fail. It is impossible to live this life in our own strength. We need each other for support and encouragement. However, the ability to overcome weariness is to come to God in a humble way, confessing our weakness, and trusting in Him to complete the promises that He has made to us in His Word.

When we do this then we can find the truth that Isaiah gives us in verse 31. We can soar like the eagle, we can run without being weary, we can walk and not faint.

We cannot do this on our own. It is God's gift to us through His Holy Spirit. Regardless of our situation in life, we can continue on through strength that has its source in and through God. Life and the struggles thereof should not and will not defeat us as long as our hope and trust is not in ourselves but in Him.

If you have become weary and have quit serving God as you once did, gather yourself up, rise up and walk, start serving Him again, and reap the rewards that He has for you.




