





Ingredients:

12pk King's Hawaiian Original Hawaiian Sweet Rolls Ground cinnamon and/or cinnamon sugar

Honey Butter:

1/2 c butter softened1/4 c honey1/4 c powdered sugar1 tsp vanilla extract

ROLL SLIDERS

CINNAMON

Cream Cheese Frosting:

8 oz cream cheese, softened 1/4 c butter, softened 2 c powdered sugar 1/2 tsp vanilla extract

Preparation:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350
- Combine softened butter, honey, vanilla, and powdered sugar in a small bowl until thoroughly mixed
- 3. Cup off the tops of the 12pk of King's Hawaiian Original Hawaiian Sweet Rolls forming one large sandwich
- 4. Spread both sides of the cut rolls generously with honey butter
- 5. Top off with ground cinnamon or cinnamon sugar
- 6. Bake at 350 for 10 minutes then let cool before adding frosting
- 7. Make frosting: combine cream cheese and butter and mix until smooth. Then, add vanilla extract and slowly mix in powdered sugar until frosting is a thick and creamy consistency
- 8. Spread frosting on top of the cinnamon/honey butter as a "filling" to our slider, then add top rolls on top
- Add another final layer of frosting on top of the top rolls, and sprinkle with cinnamon sugar (optional)
- 10. Cut and enjoy!

From Your Director of Missions

First Baptist Church in Caruthersville celebrated the 125th year of serving the community where God placed them. That means that they began in 1897. There was no one at the service that was a part of the original 16 charter members. However, the church is still in existence. That is God's plan for His church.
