



### Pilgrim Pumpkin Pie Cake

- (1) 29oz can of pumpkin (not the pie mix)
- (1) 12oz can evaporated milk
- 4 eggs
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 4 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice
- 1 package yellow cake mix
- 1 cup chopped pecans
- 2 sticks melted butter or margarine

Preheat the oven to 350°. Lightly grease a 13" X 9" pan. In large bowl, blend the first five ingredients well. Pour into your pan. Sprinkle dry cake mix evenly over top of pumpkin mixture; sprinkle evenly with chopped pecans; drizzle evenly w/melted butter or margarine.

Bake 60 minutes or longer, depending on oven. Let cool and add a dollop of Cool Whip to each serving. Enjoy!
