





Thanksgiving Day Salad

Ingredients

- ♦ 2 cups water
- ♦ 1 (6 ounce) package strawberry flavored Jell-O® mix
- ♦ 1 (10 ounce) package frozen strawberries, thawed
- ↑ 1 (16 ounce) can whole cranberry sauce
- ♦ 1/2 cup chopped pecans
- ♦ 8 leaves lettuce
- ◆ 1 (3 ounce) package cream cheese, softened
- ♦ 1 cup sour cream
- ♦ 1/3 cup white sugar
- ◆ 1 tablespoon lemon juice

Directions

- 1. Boil the water and combine with the strawberry flavored gelatin mix in a medium bowl. Mix in the strawberries, cranberry sauce and pecans. Transfer to a 2 quart mold. Chill in the refrigerator 6 to 8 hours, or overnight.
- 2. Place the molded gelatin mixture on a serving plate and surround the base with lettuce leaves.
- In a medium bowl, mix the cream cheese, sour cream, sugar and lemon juice with an electric mixer until well blended. Use this mixture as a topping for each serving of salad.


