

Nestles Toll House Death by Chocolate Cake

INGREDIENTS:

1 Box Devils Food Cake mix

1 Box 3.9 Instant Chocolate Pudding

5 Eggs

1 tsp Vanilla

3/4 Cup Oil

1 Cup Sour Cream or Buttermilk

3/4 Cup Brewed Coffee

2 Cups Nestles Toll House Chocolate Chips

DIRECTIONS:

Mix all dry ingredients together, all liquid together and blend well.

Fold in chocolate chips.

Bake in a greased bundt cake pan at 350 degrees for 45 minutes.

Let cool for 10 Minutes before turning over onto a cake plate or large round platter.

Ganache Icing:

Heat 1 stick of salted butter on stove over low heat.

Add 2 Tbsp Cocoa powder, 1/2 box powder sugar, 1 tsp Vanilla, 3 Tbsp Milk, 1/2 Cup Pecan pieces.

Pour warm over cake and serve warm if possible. If not, heat up in microwave before serving.

From Your Director of Missions

I had the opportunity to attend the revival at First Baptist Church, Caruthersville. During the message the difference between "Awakening" and "Revival" was presented.

It seems that "Awakenings" occur as a result of "Revival". When the church gets things right with God and among themselves, it allows the Spirit of God to perform great works that lead to the salvation of large groups of people that are awakened to their need for a Savior. The apostles followed the instructions of Jesus to remain in Jerusalem and as a result of their obedience 3,000 souls were awakened on the Day of Pentecost.

If we, as God's people, choose to not be revived, then God may choose to limit His activity among us. There are many examples of this in the Old Testament. Israel would turn their backs on God and serve other gods. God would withdraw His protection from them and they would be overcome by their enemies. Then God would provide a deliverer and the people would return to God for a season.

Even in the New Testament there is an example of this. Jesus did not do many miracles in His hometown because the people questioned how He was able to do these things because they knew His father and mother.

Is there anything in your church that is hindering it from being revived to the point of returning to being the light and salt in the community where God has placed it?

If revival is not being experienced, how can we expect there to be awakenings in our communities?

Churches and denominational organizations can only be successful when they are operating under the authority and direction of the Holy Spirit of God. That requires us to be faithful in our teaching of the Word of God. But, just as important, it requires us to be faithful in living what we are teaching. Samuel told Saul, "To obey is better than sacrifice".

Jesus stated that even the gates of hell cannot prevail against His Church. The reason that He could say this is because He had made all the preparations for the church to survive in the future. Remember, what His call was to Peter, Andrew, James, and John. "Follow me and I will make you to become fishers of men".

Who you are is not as important as what you are doing. The disciples believed Jesus and after many mistakes and short comings, followed Him. It irritated the religious leaders of their day. How could God possibly choose and give this kind of power to such uneducated men? The only answer that was available was that they had been with Jesus.

If we and our churches would be known as people that have been with Jesus, we could see an awakening of the lost in our communities today. What do we need to adjust to allow this to happen? DO WE NEED A REVIVAL? THE AWAKENING WITH NOT COME WITHOUT A REVIVED CHURCH.
