From Your Director of Missions

When I came into the office and turned the computer on, I had an interesting experience. The computer screen had a canary yellow tint on everything. It seems that an outside force (probably lightning) had effected the operation of the computer monitor. Things did not look like they normally would. It was useable but not something that I enjoyed looking at.

This year at our annual meeting we will be continuing the idea of the Scrappy Church book. Our theme will be "God's not done yet ... But the time is short".

Just like the computer monitor, there are many things that are having a negative effect on our churches. Church attendance is not important to many in our communities today. Activities of our children take priority over church functions, including worship services. Many do not have financial resources to give to the church because of over extensions of their lifestyles.

All of these things are taking a toll on the church. Instead of encouragement and enthusiasm, gloom and despair has creeped in. In most churches baptisms are not something that are happening on a regular basis.

So, what is your answer to the following question? Is God finished with His work in the Bootheel of Missouri?

If your answer is yes to that question, then we may as well just close the doors of our churches and just let everyone that is not already saved die and go to Hell. There is no hope because Paul said that some plant, others water and others cultivate, but it is God that gives the increase.

If your answer to that question is no, what are you doing to join God in His work in the Bootheel? He has called you to salvation for a purpose. He wants you to be salt and light in your community.

How can people be saved unless they hear about the Savior?

If God's not done yet, why are we like we are? If God wants to do things through us and our churches, why don't we let Him?

The time is short, the harvest is there, but the night is coming when man's work is done.
