## Bishop Webb's Thanksgiving Message

In one of my recent perusals of Facebook, I read these words posted by someone: "What would be there if you woke up tomorrow and all that was left were things that you thanked God for?"



As we prepare for the celebration of another Thanksgiving Day, let me share with you a question I ask myself: What kind of person are you when it comes to giving thanks?

If I'm honest, I don't always like my answer. Giving thanks is, many times, like my experience of riding a roller-coaster; there are times I am very good at it and there are other times when I am just plain horrible!

Philippians 4.4-8 shares these words with us: “Always be glad because of the Lord! I will say it again: Be glad. Always be gentle with others. The Lord will soon be here. Don't worry about anything, but pray about everything. With thankful hearts offer up your prayers and requests to God. Then, because you belong to Christ Jesus, God will bless you with peace that no one can completely understand. And this peace will control the way you think and feel. Finally, my friends, keep your minds on whatever is true, pure, right, holy, friendly, and proper. Don't ever stop thinking about what is truly worthwhile and worthy of praise.”

If you look closely at this section of Scripture, you see a number of commands given by the Apostle Paul. As he flings these commands in all directions, you get the impression that there are many spiritual irritants present at Philippi; things like depression, harshness of spirit, anxiety, failure to take prayer seriously, troubled minds, minds filled with all the wrong kinds of things... and on and on. Paul is confident that there are solutions to the problems experienced

by the people of Philippi, and thus he encourages them to change not only their actions but, more fundamentally, their attitude.

Now there is a word we need to spend some time with – ATTITUDE! The definition of attitude is “an inward feeling expressed by outward behavior.” Attitude is the core of our true selves. Attitude grows within us, yet exhibits itself outside of us through our actions. Attitude determines our approach to life – our approach to others – our approach to God. I’m good at displaying attitude – the problem is, often the attitude I display is not a good one.

A little boy was asked by his father to say grace at the table. While the rest of the family waited the little boy eyed every dish of food his mother had prepared. After the examination, he bowed his head and prayed honestly, “Lord, I don’t like the looks of it, but I thank you for it, and I’ll eat it anyway. Amen.”

Paul called the Philippians to an attitude of thanksgiving that is constant within their lives. Paul called those early believers – and now calls us – to a discipline of thanksgiving that goes beyond a day or an activity to become a mindset and a lifestyle. We are called to an attitude of thanksgiving that is affected and shaped by an upward focus, outward focus and inward focus.

**What kind of person are you when it comes to giving thanks?**

**How intentional are you about developing ways to allow thanksgiving to be a constant attitude in your life?**

**Is the act and spirit of thanksgiving your first reaction or a last resort when all other approaches fail?**

As you gather on Thanksgiving Day, wherever it is you gather and with whomever you gather, I hope you have a great day! I hope you will enjoy the traditions of the day.

But be sure to remember that for us God-followers, Thanksgiving is more than a Thursday in November. It’s more than enjoying turkey, pumpkin pie and football. Thanksgiving is an attitude – and when it comes to thanksgiving, having an attitude is a good thing!
