The World Wide Communion Sunday offering will be received today. This offering will help support the future leadership of the church and community.

This year, our Annual Meeting/Church Conference will be held at Faith UMC, Wolcott from 2:30-4:30 p.m. with worship beginning at 3:30 pm **today**. At this meeting we will elect church officers for 2015, set the pastor's compensation for the coming year, and receive reports. Our new District Superintendent, Rev. Jeff McDowell, will lead worship; another pastor will chair this annual meeting. All church members are welcome—all are eligible to vote.
