Today is Souper Bowl Sunday, and we are inviting you to join forces & battle hunger for those in our community by bringing a can of soup or another non-perishable item to donate to our food pantry or give a cash donation. The Church Council met a few weeks ago, and upon recommendation of the Trustees, authorized the purchase of a new elevator to replace our old unrepairable one. The new lift, a Genesis VPL Garavent, will be purchased from and installed by Victory Lift, Inc. It will be similar to our old one, however, it will have many improvements and meet current code standards. It will fit in the existing shaft and is expected to be installed and operational within five to six weeks. If you would like a copy of the details and specifications, please contact the Church Office. The cost of the new lift is \$30,624. As of November 1, 2014, the Trustees' Elevator Fund contained \$5,500.00. Since then, \$6,156.23 more has been donated, for a current total of \$11,656.23. Our church is blessed by these generous contributions, but obviously, more are needed. If you have not already made a donation for the new elevator, please consider one now. The belief that our church services, studies, meetings and fellowship activities should be accessible to all people, at all times, necessitates the installation of this new elevator. Please help make this commitment a reality with your financial support. It will be greatly appreciated.
