***Call to Worship from Galatians 5:16-25**

Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh.

For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit,

and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh;

for these are opposed to each other, to prevent me from doing what I want. But if we are led by the Spirit, we are not subject to the law.

Now the works of the flesh are obvious: fornication, impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these.

If we live in the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit. Together let us worship God.
