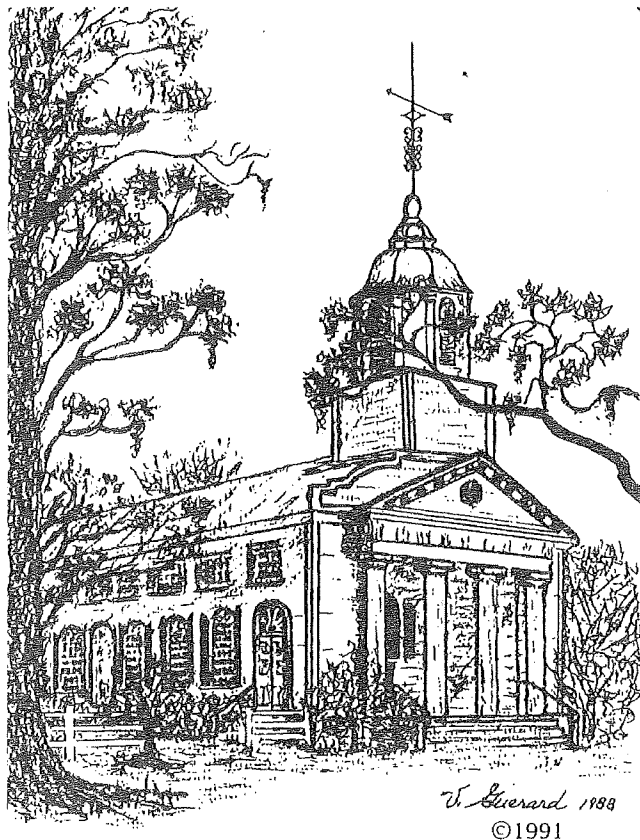

Sharing of Communion at the Long Tables
