





Ways To Ride A Dead Horse

The tribal wisdom of the Dakota Indians passed on from generation to generation says that when you discover that you are riding a dead horse, the best strategy is to dismount.

Modern churches, however, have found a whole range of far more advanced strategies to use, such as:

- 1. Get a bigger whip.
- 2. Changeriders.
- 3. Remind everyone, "God told us to ride this horse."
- 4. Appoint a committee to study your horse.
- 5. Appoint a committee to study how other groups ride their dead horses.
- 6. Threaten the horse with termination.
- 7. Proclaim, "This is the way we've always ridden this horse."
- 8. Develop a training session to improve our riding ability.
- 9. Remind ourselves that other churches ride dead horses also.
- 10. Determine that riders who don't stay on dead horses are lazy, lack drive, and have no ambition then replace them.
- 11. Lower the standards so that dead horses can be included.
- 12. Hire an outside consultant to advise you on how to better ride the horse.
- 13. Harness several dead horses together to increase the speed.
- 14. Change the physical position of the dead horse so it looks alive.
- 15. Provide additional funding and/or training to increase the dead horse's performance.
- 16. Ride the dead horse "outside the box."

- 18. Kill all the other horses so the dead one doesn't stand out.
- 19. Take a positive outlook pronouncing that the dead horse doesn't have to be fed, it is less costly, carries lower overhead, and therefore contributes substantially more to the bottom line of the church's budget than do some other horses.
- 20. Rewrite the expected performance requirements for all horses.
- 21. Promote the dead horse to a supervisory position.
- 22. Name the dead horse, "paradigm shift" and keep riding it.
- 23. Ride the dead horse "smarter, not harder."
- 24. State that other styles of riding dead horses reflect compromise, and are not from God.
- 25. Remember all the good times you had while riding that horse.
- 26. Get a new saddle.

Baptists' Theological Distinctives & Beliefs: Why are we Baptists?

On October 31st Martin Luther shared his 95 point thesis on needed Catholic Church reforms. This is important since he was a Catholic priest and professor that had his life transformed radically as he experienced a near death experience. During this period in his life he was teaching the book of Romans. As he taught it and expounded upon the scriptures his own life was touched and transformed and he began to seek spiritual reformation in the Catholic Church. His efforts were rebuffed by the hierarchy of the Catholic Church, and he was persecuted for his beliefs and reformation efforts. However, he set in motion the Protestant reformation movement which would impact the world, and return the Bible back into the hands of the laity, and focus back on the basics of Christianity. What does it mean to be a Protestant? These are five of the major teachings of the reformers by which they distinguished their beliefs from those of the Roman Catholic church of their day. As Baptists these theological points formed who we are today.

- **1. Sola Scriptura** "The Bible alone." Scripture alone speaks authoritatively, and it speaks to all believers, independently of church leaders and councils, human interpreters and so-called spokesmen for God.
- **2. Sola Gratia** "Grace alone." It is only by the unmerited favor of God that Christ went to the cross and paid the price for man's salvation. Man is by nature depraved—he has no virtue that commends him to God. Therefore God's grace to him is truly undeserved and amazing, and God's grace alone has the power to draw people to himself.
- **3. Sola Fide** "Faith alone." Only total righteousness is acceptable to God, and that is found in Christ, not us. Man can only accept Christ's work by placing his trust in him. Man is justified by faith alone in the finished work of Christ, not by any works of his own.
- **4. Sola Christus** "Christ alone." Salvation is accomplished by Christ alone, and mediated by Christ alone—not by angels, saints, relics, sacraments, priests, teachers, churches, or anyone or anything else. Christ alone was the perfect Savior, and he alone is the perfect prophet, priest and king.
- **5. Soli Deo Gloria** "To God alone be glory." God should be thanked, praised and given full credit for his sovereign grace and spiritual and physical provision. Theology should be Godcentered, not man-centered. God should be put in his place and humans in theirs. Our efforts should not elevate and celebrate men but God. We should bring him glory in our work, in our homes and at play. He, not we, should be the center of all things.

Barry's thoughts We should never be ashamed to be called "Christians" or a "Bible believing people". I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, nor am I ashamed of my Savior, who lovingly and willingly sacrificed himself for me and my sins upon the altar of that cross in order to bring me and you, including every sinner, back to our loving and gracious God. Be proud to be called by the name of "Christ" and to be counted among the faithful few referred to as "Bible-believing" PTL! It is not bad to be "Baptist" as we follow in Jesus Christ's footsteps and as we put into practice his love and obey His word.

I have felt pulled in many directions and under stress to get aid to the victims as soon as possible. As I reflect and process all that has happened in a short amount of time. I feel stretched out like a rubber band that has been stretched and stretched past its limit of bouncing back, and I know that many of you feel the same way. It seems that living life now demands so much of us. Many of us are working more than one job, and juggling our time and money like never before, stretching us in ways that we never imagined. Life today stretches us time wise, financially, health-wise, fighting an invisible virus and all the complications that go with it. I see and have talked with many persons who state that they are stretched beyond their means at the present time. There just seems to be too many demands, and too much expected of us. We are doing more with less, it seems. Our families and loved ones are affected as



we work and care for them at the same time. We are now working from home more and more which brings work stress into the family environment like never before. It just seems like everything is spinning out of our control, which confuses and stresses us out even more. We finally get into a routine and then suddenly everything changes again, and we are thrown back to learning a new process all over again. Agh

It has been well documented that there has been a spike in physical confrontations and conflicts on airplane flights, in domestic abuse cases, and road rage incidents. Violence has increased and people just seem to be a powder keg waiting for a reason to explode and vent at someone when the pressure gets to be too much for them to handle. Our tempers are hot and with shorter fuses than ever before. We are easily provoked and super sensitive to just a wrong glance or a slip of words, and Bam! We explode at some innocent store clerk or airline stewardess just trying to do their job, who has done nothing deserving such a tirade. It seems like we have just been pressed beyond our natural limits and are just re-acting to any little provocation in order to vent our pent up frustrations and feelings of helplessness on someone else. I am with you, and if we are all honest we all have felt these emotions sweep over us at times.

When I feel like life is spinning out of control, and I am at the point of losing it all I remember these practices:

- Stop and breathe for a minute. Be still. Step away from everybody, excuse yourself.
- Self- reflect and do a self-check. What is it that has me at a boiling point?
- Does the person that I am interacting with deserve my wrath and pent up anger? Is this person just trying to do his / her job like I would be in their spot?
- Look in the mirror and ask yourself, "What will I look like to this other person if I release my anger and frustration on them?" We all want to leave a positive impression with those we work with, and interact with in life. How will they view me after this outburst?
- What are the consequences for myself, for my family and loved ones, and for my job if I just lambast this person with all my venom and boiling emotions? Do I really want to deal with these negative consequences and their fall-out? No, I do not. How can I avoid this from happening?

- Ask yourself, "Am I ready to return to work, or to my family with more positive energy and emotions?" For myself, as a believer, I need to spend some quality time with my Maker and putting things back in context from His perspective. I need to put the axle back in middle of the wheel and move forward with a new attitude. I need to refocus my Spirit on God again. I need to see the situation from God's perspective. Dose my anger glorify God? No!
- Ask for help from others. Be transparent and talk with your friends in your social network that give you positive feedback and encouragement. Constructive comments are welcome! It feels so much better after you have opened up and talked with someone about your frustrations. You were never meant to carry all these burdens and stresses on your own. I Peter 5:7

... August's Message of Hope From the desk of Barry Barnet to you


Luke 13:6-9 (HCSB)


⁶ And He told this parable: "A man had a fig tree that was planted in his vineyard. He came looking for fruit on it and found none.

⁷ He told the vineyard worker, 'Listen, for three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree and haven't found any. Cut it down! Why should it even waste the soil?'

⁸ "But he replied to him, 'Sir, leave it this year also, until I dig around it and fertilize it.

⁹ Perhaps it will bear fruit next year, but if not, you can cut it down."





The Lord has impressed upon me through this process that I am, and you are like those cactus leaves. We are alive, and fighting to grow fresh and in new ways. I was struck by the thought that we too need fertilizer thrown into our lives from time to time. We get down, our churches struggle, and we fail to see or understand what God is doing underneath the surface of our lives. We get down and discouraged, maybe even sinking into depression. However, God is like the farmer or vineyard caretaker above in the scriptures. The world and people around us say it is time to uproot the fruitless and unproductive person, maybe even referring to us! Yet God is the patient and ever-loving gardener who still holds out hope that He can infuse and pour into us a fresh manifestation of His Holy Spirit reviving and refreshing us and our faith. Our churches need a season of receiving some fertilizer from God's patient hands through His Holy Spirit.

If you have ever had an illness and you felt wore out and exhausted physically, and then you went to the doctor and he prescribed antibiotics and vitamins for you and almost instantly you notice the difference. Your body is revived and strengthened again. You feel like you could run a marathon race! What a difference!

In this passage, as I look at it, some thoughts pop into my head: 1) Who defines what shape the fruit takes? 2) Some of us are plowers, others are sowers, and others water the seed, while still others are the harvesters. Each one has his purpose and fruit, and it will look distinct from the others. 3.) We all go through times and stages of life where we do not feel fruitful. Be careful to not let your emotions dry up your fruitfulness in the Lord. The fruit is forming on the stem. 4.) We all need some fertilizer thrown on us at times, accept it and let it do its job. 5. How can we fertilize others? How can I encourage those around me who are down, discouraged, or in despair? 6.) Whenever I see an opportunity to cast some positive fertilizer do I respond with compassion and a sensitive heart, or am I too quick to judge and up-root, destroying the plant.



7.) Be glad and thankful that God does not give up on us, but will lovingly cast some fertilizer our way when we need it the most. 8.) Remember, fertilizer takes some time to do its work and boost the struggling plant, give it a chance to work and be patient with the feeble plant as it struggles to respond.

I thank God that He did not up-root me when I was in a fruitless place and struggling to make my way forward and bear fruit for Him.

Thanks God for your times of refreshment and bearing with me. Thanks for the fertilizer! Think about it! ... from Barry Barnet, DOM.

During this past week of getting away and visiting with family, reconnecting after so much time apart due to Covid 19, I was walking with my dad and he was showing me his cactus plant. This cactus plant caught my attention as it had been strong and spreading, but was now basically a pile of decaying dead leaves. 



The volunteers would be amazed because that was something that they took for granted in the USA. in their church associations, and Christian fellowship between like-minded believers and churches. Fellowship is something so simple yet we often overlook its importance in our lives and churches. As your Director of Missions for Colorado Baptist Association, I want to emphasize that we as individual Christians and churches need spiritual Christian fellowship like humans need air to survive. I want to encourage you and your local church to make a new commitment to fellowship with other churches. One of the key reasons that Baptist Associations came into being was for the purpose of fellowship, and building up each other in our Christian walk, faith, δ practice. WE NEED EACH OTHER!!! ¹³ I am able to do all things through Him who strengthens me.


¹⁴ Still, you did well by sharing with me in my hardship.

We too wore about 4 layers of clothes and our jackets, coats, knit hats, and gloves in our house as we awaited for the electricity to come back on. We had water, but no electricity, no wifi, no cell phone coverage on Linda's cell phone, ...etc.... We did learn some things from the winter storms, like our next house will have a fireplace, and a gas stove to cook on.. We also learned a lot spiritually as the TV was off, radio was off, cell phone use limited, and computer usage was limited to battery life. We did the "car warm up" as we drove around El Campo trying to absorb as much heat as possible in as brief a time as possible, while recharging our cell phones in the car. We went to the stores just to get warm and to see empty shelves. It was worse than after Hurricane Harvey! Through the cold, God spoke as we opened up our Bibles and began reading just for the fun of it, no sermon preparation, no Bible study prep, and no devotional preparation, but just to spend time with God in His Word, with no distractions, obligations, or responsibilities. It was great, although limited by my poor vision in dim light at times.

Paul had learned the secret of life: contentment in Jesus Christ. He learned to be thankful and content when he had an abundance and when he was in poverty, when he had a surplus of food, and when he was starving. I was humbled by God during this time when everything we take for granted was stripped away from us, reducing us back to living like cavemen fighting against the elements to survive. Linda asked me, "How did the Native Americans survive?" I do not know, but they had to be tough and prepared. The positive thing for me that I learned was that I have way too many things and distractions in my life which I could do without. I would not enjoy it, but I could survive with God's help and resources. I was so happy to be able to cook on our BBQ gas grill and heat up water for coffee, and hot chocolate or broth. I was so happy and thankful!!!!

It was great to grill food on the BBO and feel the warmth!!!

<u>God teach us to be thankful and content</u> with what you give us! You never promised to give us everything we wish or desire, however, you have promised to provide for our needs. It was great to see and her reports of how people helped out others during the freezing temperatures. Crisis bring out the best or worst in us. Hopefully Jesus is seen in and through us in the midst of our crisis. Think about it. Barry Barnet

1 Peter 1:3-9 (HCSB)

- ³ Praise the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. According to His great mercy, He has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead
- ⁴ and into an inheritance that is imperishable, uncorrupted, and unfading, kept in heaven for you.
- ⁵ You are being protected by God's power through faith for a salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time.
- ⁶ You rejoice in this, though now for a short time you have had to struggle in various trials
- ⁷ so that the genuineness of your faith—more valuable than gold, which perishes though refined by fire—may result in praise, glory, and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ.
- ⁸ You love Him, though you have not seen Him. And though not seeing Him now, you believe in Him and rejoice with inexpressible and glorious joy,
- ⁹ because you are receiving the goal of your faith, the salvation of your souls.



One of my favorite TV programs to watch is "Forged in Iron" where contestants who are "blade-smiths" compete against each other to produce the best hand fabricated metal weapons, which are judged by experts in the field. It is very interesting to me as we watch the cold metal pieces welded together and put into a forge to melt the metals together into one solid new piece of glowing hot metal ready to be forged and molded into a new weapon to be judged by the experts. On one night's program, all 4 of the contestants had a hard time getting their sections of metal to melt and forge into one solid block to then forge their weapons. All 4 blade-smiths failed the first test by the experts. All of the weapons in their crude form had cracks and deformations in their metal forms, after much heating and melting. The judges struck their weapons against a solid metal object and all four were found to be defective. Those deformations and cracks in the metal could not hold together when they were placed under stress and severe impacts. The metal weapons in their crude form all cracked or split under stress and were no good to be used or judged. They were deemed to be defective and unsafe to be judged any further. The contestants were disqualified and had to leave in shame.

While I watched this program, I could not help, but to think about the above verses which speak of our faith as being more valuable than gold. God says through the writer, Peter, that the believers' faith was being tried, tested by fire, or like metals being placed inside a fiery heated forge to melt and purify the metal to its purest form. I was reminded that all of us, believers, and not believers, are being stressed and put under so much pressure today due to Covid-19, finances, health issues, family crisis, politics, and the fear of the unknown... that our minds, bodies, and souls are being tested by fire and burdened by all these things weighing down on us that we just cannot bear any more stresses, before we snap like those weapons. I believe from reading God's Word and His promises to us that God does not intend for us to bear up under such pressure and burdens by ourselves, we are not strong enough. Our backs and bodies will break. Our minds and souls will become overwhelmed and shut down under such stresses and pressure. It is never God's intention to snap our faith or break our confidence in Him. It is not God's will to allow us to be overwhelmed by too much suffering. He knows our limitations as humans. Often times, we assume too many burdens and too much pressure through our own choices and decisions. We weigh ourselves down and then we feel bad, sad, and paralyzed by our own self-imposed burdens and stresses. Who can we blame for assuming too much, and losing our joy and freedom to serve our Lord as He wishes? Not God. The problem is, even as Christians, that we fall back into idolatry, the worship of material things, or we put employment positions above serving and loving God as He demands from us. He wants our full attention and whole-hearted love without any idolatry / idols coming between us and our love for Him. God wants to be our first love, and to be our one and only true love, unwavering in devotion. Do not be afraid to say "No, no more burdens, no more distractions, no more stress!"

1 Corinthians 10:12-14 (HCSB)

- ¹² So, whoever thinks he stands must be careful not to fall.
- ¹³ No temptation has overtaken you except what is common to humanity. God is faithful, and He will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation He will also provide a way of escape so that you are able to bear it.
- ¹⁴ Therefore, my dear friends, flee from idolatry.

God does not want your car, house, bank accounts, or job. He just wants your complete and total love and attention focusing upon Him. He wants us to be uncompromisingly devoted to growing in our faith, understanding His will, and serving Him in unswerving obedience.
