I had the opportunity to attend our statewide DOM Conference this past week in Jefferson City. One thing I learned – among many things – has helped me understand some of the struggles we have here in our association and our own churches. It was reported at the conference that though there are about 2100 churches affiliated with the Missouri Baptist Convention, on any given day about 700 of them are without a pastor. That is one out of three!

We are very fortunate here in the Lake of the Ozarks Association. We recently went about 18 months when all 27 of our churches has a pastor. Even now, we only have two pastorless churches – Spring Valley and Spring Garden.

These two churches have not been receiving very many resumes, though, which is making their pastoral search a bit more challenging, We also have not had any resumes or applicants for summer missionaries yet.

We have all seen in the broader economy of our day, that there is a shortage of workers – stores, restaurants, factories – everyone is short of the necessary personnel to function well. Perhaps that is part of the reason why there are so many pastorless churches. But perhaps there are other reasons as well

When businesses have trouble getting employees, they often begin to offer more in the way of ay and benefits Then they can attract worker from other places to come work for them. They pass this additional cost on to the customer, of course, by charging more for their goods and services. I know of many churches, however (some even in our own association), that have not given their pastor a raise in years. I don't mean just two or three years, I mean like years and years.....Some churches have said they cannot afford to pay their pastor more. Well, that just means the people in the church are probably not tithing. Wouldn't tithing more be the equivalent of a business raising its prices?

I know of very few men who are in the ministry for the money . . . but the Bible does say that a man is to take care of his own household, and if he doesn't he is worse than an unbeliever. And if a church doesn't provide as generously as they are able for their pastor they bear the guilt of him not being able to care for his family.

BTW – With one/third of the churches in our state not having a pastor, if your church has a pastor you have better take care of him cause he will be hard to replace.

Another matter consider is whether churches and pastors are engaged in calling out the called. Nearly every church has a time at the end of the service when lost people are invited to come to salvation in Jesus – yet few lost people attend worship services in any given week. On the other hand, when was that last time your church invited those already following Christ to surrender to His call to vocational service – as ministers, missionaries, etc.? Where do we think our pastors and missionaries come from? They come from the pews, from those who are already following Christ to some degree and just need to step up to His greater call on their life. Perhaps you are even among those . . . Is God calling you to do more?
