Well 2020 is over. Along with the passing of the year, I truly hope a phrase I have come to hate will also pass....That hated phrase that was so misused in 2020 is "In these unprecedented times..."

First, time is a continuum. We are always moving forward in time. We can look back on time, but cannot truly go back in time. We cannot go back to 2020 (thankfully). Nor can we go back to any other time. And because we cannot go back in time, we can never go through the same period of time twice. Thus, every moment of time is, by its very nature, unprecedented.

Also, that phrase "these unprecedented times" is an oxymoron. To say that "these" are unprecedented times implies that other times are not unprecedented. But that simply is not true. All time is unprecedented. For instance, when Israel crossed the Jordan River into the Promised Land, it was an unprecedented time. The Revolutionary War, the Great Depression, and World War II, were also all unprecedented times. In fact, a child going to Kindergarten is experiencing something he has never experienced before. There is no precedent for the person learning to drive, graduate from high school, or anything else. Even if we return to a favorite place for vacation from year to year, we may say "remember that time that...." And in so doing are distinguishing that time in the past from the time in the present, and thus the present time is "unprecedented".

Having clarified that (I hope), let us remember that indeed all time is new. We are in a new month, a new year, and will be facing new challenges. Even if we have the "routine" of the same job, the same family dynamics, the same Super Bowl Champions (??) we will experience these aspects of life from a different perspective based on age, health, economy, and other factors. So you see, truly nothing stays the same (except for the Word of God, but that is for another discussion).

As Israel got ready to cross the Jordan (Joshua 3) the people were given this admonition: ...there shall be between you and it (the ark of the covenant, representing the presence of God) a distance of about 2,000 cubits by measure. Do not come near it, that you may know the way by which you shall go, for you have not passed this way before.

They were to keep God before them (as represented in the ark). They were to go where the ark went. They were not to be distracted by the enemies around them, the beauty of the land, or even the desires of their own countrymen. Why? Because they had not been that way before – it was new territory, a new time, it was "unprecedented"!

Joshua then told the people (v.5) to consecrate themselves for tomorrow the Lord would do wonders among them. He had previously told them – as he himself had been told – to be strong and courageous.

We would be wise to follow these three things as well, even as we look forward to a less noteworthy year.....be strong and courageous, consecrate ourselves, and keep the Lord ever before us. Though we have not been this way before, when we do these three things we find that He is already there before us, and where He is, we have peace.
