- This is the Presbytery's *Ministry and Mission Grants*, for a particular project/program/mission.
- The project must be **sponsored by** a congregation in our presbytery.
- The grant is for <u>new</u> projects but will consider an already operating project (e.g. support for individuals going on a mission trip).
- Entire application must be completed.
- Get in touch with the Presbytery Office to have an application emailed or mailed to you.
- The grant is seed money to support the start of or exploration for a project/program/mission. Grant amounts tend to vary from \$500 to \$5000.
- The <u>deadline</u> for receiving applications is Wednesday, March 30.
- Grant monies, will be awarded by May 30, the time period in which the contact person will receive the initial 70% of the award.
- A progress report is <u>due</u> by **November 1.**
- The final 30% of the grant will be received by November 30, only if the progress report has been received.
