



Praying to change our potential...

"But be sure to fear the LORD and serve him faithfully with all your heart; consider what great things he has done for you."

1 Samuel 12:24 (NIV 2011)

Have you ever seen potential in someone, yet they don't see the potential himself? You see the possibilities; he sees the mistakes or the inabilities. You see what could be; he sees what has always been. Well, you're not alone. Samuel was nearing the end of his role and wanted the people to understand what God could do for them if they would only fear and serve Him faithfully.

Samuel was not happy that Israel had requested a king be put over them, but Saul had been anointed and it was done. Samuel had not agreed with the past but did not want the past to dictate their future. He made it abundantly clear that their decision was mistake, but what they did from that point forward was not determined by their past mistake. He wanted the Israelites to rid their hearts of idols and serve the Lord, the One who had given them so much. In fact, he encouraged them to NOT make the same mistakes of the past, but to change their pattern (v.25).

Doesn't this sound familiar? The Gospel expects us to do the same. No matter what we have done in the past, God expects us to look at things differently, act differently, and have a different focus. This not only changes our focus but changes our potential. We no longer look at our mistakes or our inabilities but look more to our possibilities and abilities. We could beat ourselves up all day about what we have done in the past or we could move forward. At the same time, we must remember to ACTUALLY MOVE forward and not remain stagnant. It doesn't do us any good to "not beat ourselves up" and then remain where we are." We must change, thereby, changing our potential.

Great potential exists in our community, but change must occur. We cannot persist in the way we are and expect that things will change. Samuel committed to pray (v.23) for the Israelites. I wonder if we would do the same, praying to change the potential of our community.

Chocolate Chip Cookie Delight

Recipe from Taste of Home


Yield: 15 servings **Prep:** 35 minutes + chilling

Ingredients:

- 1 tube (16-1/2 ounces) refrigerated chocolate chip cookie dough
- 1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup confectioners' sugar
- 1 carton (12 ounces) frozen whipped topping, thawed, divided
- 3 cups cold 2% milk
- 1 package (3.9 ounces) instant chocolate pudding mix
- 1 package (3.4 ounces) instant vanilla pudding mix
- Optional: Chopped nuts, chocolate curls and miniature semisweet chocolate chips

Directions:

- Let cookie dough stand at room temperature for 5 -10 minutes to soften. Press into an ungreased 13x9-in. baking pan. Bake at 350° until golden brown, 14-16 minutes. Cool on a wire rack.
- 2. In a large bowl, beat cream cheese and confectioners' sugar until smooth. Fold in 1-3/4 cups whipped topping. Spread over crust.
- 3. In a large bowl, whisk milk and pudding mixes for 2 minutes. Spread over cream cheese layer. Top with remaining whipped topping. Sprinkle with nuts and chocolate curls if desired.
- 4. Cover and refrigerate until firm, 8 hours or overnight.
