COMMUNION WORSHIP SERVICE OPTIONS

INSIDE WORSHIP SERVICES

Inside worship services are held each weekend, **Saturday's at 5:30 pm** and **Sundays at 9:30 am**. Our capacity is **100** in the **sanctuary**, **15** in the **balcony** and an overflow of **60** in the **Fellowship Hall** if necessary. That limits worship to **175** at each service.

LIVE STREAMED OR ON DEMAND

For those who are not ready to return to the sanctuary at this time, the **9:30 am** service will be **live-streamed** on our **Facebook page**, <https://www.facebook.com/LCORKokomo/>. After the service it can be watched on demand on www.LCORKokomo.org/.

DRIVE-IN SERVICE

Want to come to church, but hesitant to come inside. Join us in the parking lot at **9:30 AM** on **Sunday mornings**. Drive through to the narthex doors to receive your bulletin and communion set from an usher. Park in the lot and **tune your radio to 89.1 FM** and worship along with your brothers and sisters in Christ who are in the sanctuary.

Please note at this time, the **first** and **third weekends** of the month will be **blended** with both **traditional hymns** and **contemporary praise music**. The **second** and **fourth** weekends of the month, we will have **traditional** services. Thank you.

104 REDEEMER LUTHERAN SCHOOL - [PRESCHOOL - 8TH GRADE]

B. WORSHIP ENRICHMENT

201 WELCOME CENTER & GREETERS

209 PRAISE TEAM

The primary purpose of a praise team is to give glory to God and facilitate the worship of the congregation. Our praise team consists of singers and band members. The singers are responsible for leading the congregational singing. Their first job, therefore, is to make sure the melody is well heard. They are encouraged to add harmony when possible. The band is made up of a few guitars, one bass, one drummer, and one or two keyboards. Their objective is to support the singers and add variety to the service. The team usually rehearses on a weekly basis in preparation for the Contemporary Services which occur on the first and third Sundays of each month. CONTACT: Church Office

This choir sings contemporary Christian music with an occasional traditional selection. We perform 1 - 2 times per month. Our rehearsal schedule varies, but averages 2 - 3 rehearsals per month. CONTACT: Church Office

GUIDELINES relating to the BLESSED SACRAMENT

WHO SHOULD COMMUNE?:

Because the Lutheran Church believes the Risen Lord is present in the consecrated bread and wine of the Sacrament, we practice "close communion" only those who have been instructed in the Lutheran Faith commune at its altars. This is done out of loving concern that those who receive the Sacrament know and believe -- and thus benefit from -- what they here received: the very body and blood of Christ, once given and shed for the forgiveness of sin. If you are not a confirmed Lutheran, one of our pastors would be happy to speak with you about your desire to commune.

HOW OFTEN IS HOLY COMMUNION CELEBRATED BY OUR CONGREGATION?

We commune at all weekend worship services, and the following special days: Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Easter, Pentecost, Christmas Day and New Year's Eve.

HOW OFTEN SHALL I COMMUNE?

In I Corinthians 11: 25, 26, the Apostle Paul reminds us of the command of Christ to come often, and then adds that *as often as we eat this bread and drink this cup*, we publicly proclaim that Christ died for us. We are encouraged to commune often because of our continual need for communion with God and forgiveness of sins. Jesus Christ promises to be present and to bestow His forgiveness upon us personally in this Sacrament, "This is My blood...poured out...for the forgiveness of sins." [Matthew 26:28]

HOW ARE CHILDREN INCLUDED?

Families are encouraged to commune together. Children are invited to kneel at the altar and receive a blessing.

WHY DO I BOW MY HEAD BEFORE AND AFTER RECEIVING THE SACRAMENT?

The bowed head is a sign of humility and need as I approach the Lord's Table in all of my sinfulness. Before returning to the pew, I bow my head in gratitude for the gift of His presence and my forgiveness.

HOW CAN I PREPARE MYSELF AT HOME FOR COMMUNION?

Prior to the time of Communion, take your Bible or other helpful written resources and spend some time alone with your Lord.

1. Begin with a prayer for the Holy Spirit, for it is He alone Who can work true repentance.
2. Read one of the following penitential Psalms: 32, 51, 130; or 84, 85, or 86.
3. Use the Ten Commandments as a measure of your life to find where you have failed to keep God's Holy law in doing wrong and omitting to do good.
4. In your self-examination ask three questions:
 - a] Do I truly repent of my sins?
 - B] Do I believe in Jesus Christ as my Savior?
 - C] Do I have sincere purpose with the aid of the Holy Spirit henceforth to amend my sinful life?
5. Ask yourself the "Christian Questions with their answers," [Luther's Small Catechism, pages 40-44; also in Lutheran Service Book hymnal, pages 329-330.]
6. Close with a prayer, for example: Prayer for faith, for true repentance, for the blessings of Holy Communion.

WHAT CAN I DO TO MAKE THE RECEPTION OF THE SACRAMENT MORE MEANINGFUL TO ME WHILE I AM IN CHURCH?

- 1] Before the service of Communion, come early to have time for meditation.
- 2] Psalms 84, 85, 86 or 130 are contained in the front pages of the Hymnal for your devotion time.
- 3] Also a "Prayer Before Communing" found inside the front cover of the Lutheran Service Book hymnal.
- 4] While standing at the altar, you may find it helpful to keep a mental picture of the crucifixion, or of Christ as He most appeals to you.
- 5] When receiving the Sacrament, say a silent prayer like, "Lord, I am not worthy to receive this Heavenly Meal -- strengthen my faith."
- 6] When you return to the pew, offer up a prayer - a suggestion; A Prayer of Thanksgiving after receiving the Sacrament found inside the front cover of the Lutheran Service Book hymnal. May you have an appointment often with the Savior at the Heavenly Meal to which He so urgently invites you.

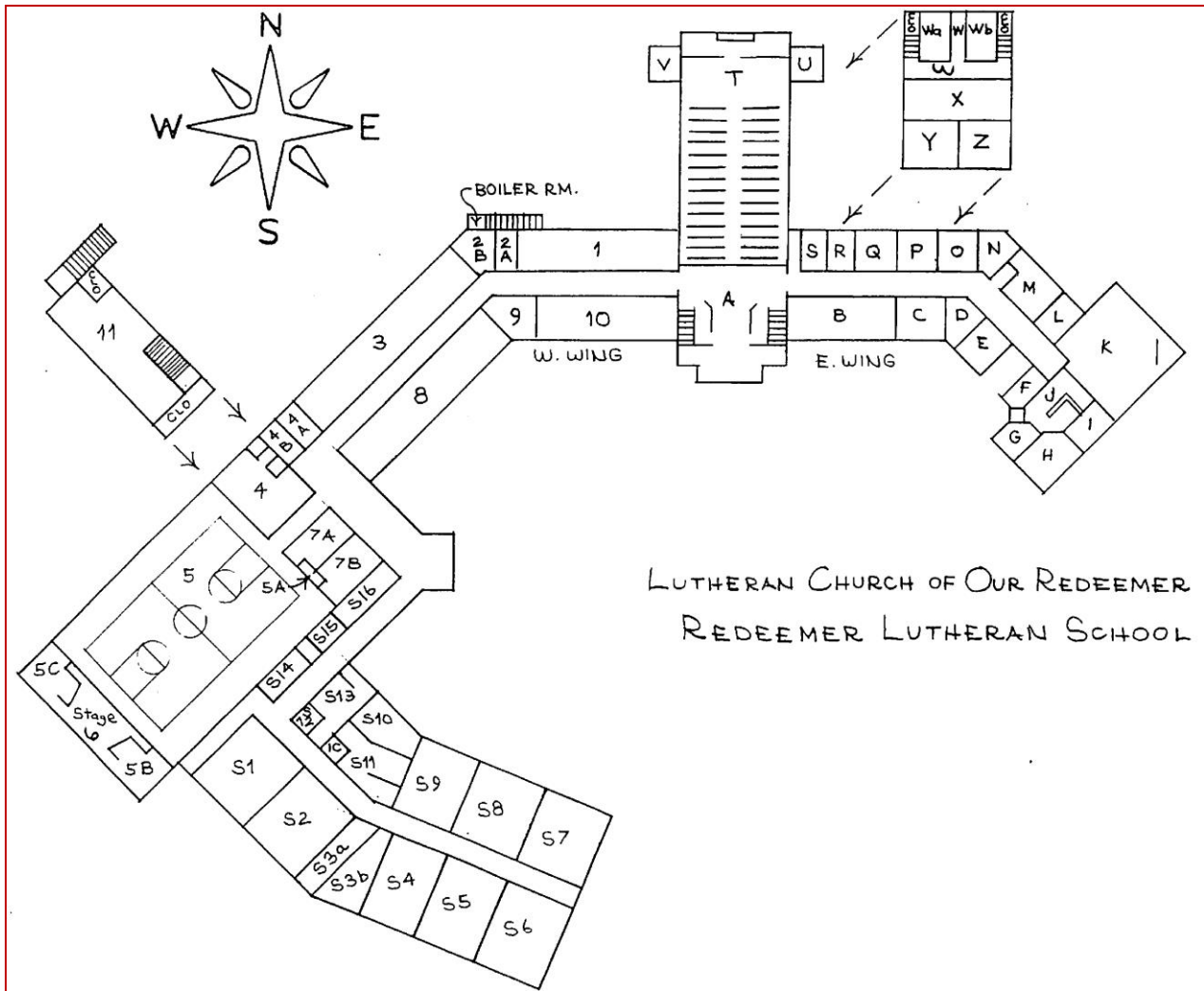
