"20 And those twelve stones, which they took out of the Jordan, Joshua set up at Gilgal. 21 And he said to the people of Israel, "When your children ask their fathers in times to come, 'What do these stones mean?' 22 then you shall let your children know, 'Israel passed over this Jordan on dry ground.' 23 For the LORD your God dried up the waters of the Jordan for you until you passed over, as the LORD your God did to the Red Sea, which he dried up for us until we passed over, 24 so that all the peoples of the earth may know that the hand of the LORD is mighty, that you may fear the LORD your God forever." ~ Joshua 4: 20 – 24

As I reflect on the journey of these past 12 days, I have decided without hesitation that you will hear these stories for months to come. I will not even attempt to summarize them in less because they should be remembered, and the stories deserve telling. So for today, I will reflect on some of the new insights I gained from wandering in this very complex land.

There is a Biblical command which is honored throughout Israel to remember and tell the stories. The people of Israel, regardless of tradition or faith background, have great respect for the history of the land and preserving the stories that have been passed down from generation to generation there. Muslims, Jews, and Christians all have historical ties to Abraham and his journey through this land. They all want those stories and their places protected. Their respect for one another concerning this history was unexpected and impressive.

The amount of "clutter" surrounding some of the holy sites was distracting to me at first. I found it challenging to find the sacred space amidst all the human trappings that had been placed upon it. I also found it highly improbable that the angels appeared to the shepherds in the same field where Ruth and Naomi met Boaz.

Then I remembered the verses from Joshua where we are commanded to remember...

Whether or not these places are historically the exact places where some of these events occurred, they are the places where people have gathered to retell the story, to remember, and to pass down these stories for generation after generation. These are the places of oral tradition. These are the places where thousands of people from all different parts of the world have come with their own ways of worshipping, their own traditions, and their personal stories, to show love for God in their own ways. These are their places to remember.

Once I could embrace that collective act of worship and memory, I was less distracted by the places that seemed overrun by icons and symbols. I was drawn to watch people, to see how others revered these spaces, how others honored God, and to respect their forms of worship.

Even so, the most precious moments of this journey came for me when all the clutter was pulled away, when the excavation took us down to the first century stones, and we were allowed to walk on the cobblestone streets that Jesus walked. During those hot, dusty, dirty moments in the Israeli sun, God felt more near to me than in the highly decorated churches built on top of other churches filled with icons and incense. Many more stories will come, about the sites and especially about the people, in the months to come.


