Proverbs 3:5-6 (NRSV) - ⁵ Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not rely on your own insight. ⁶ In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.

I am a at the core of my personality a planner. I prefer to prepare and design exactly how any course of events might go, prepare for contingencies, and create a plan B, plan C, and even an occasional plan D. In light of this part of my nature, these verses create a bit of a rub. Perhaps I rely too much on my own insight, and this is a good reminder for me to trust God first.

One particular word here makes a big difference — "rely." We are not being directed to ignore our own insights. We most certainly ought to use our best skills in any situation in order to honor God with our gifts. The command here is to trust God *first*, and to rely upon God *first*, using our insights in a secondary, advisory role. Heartaches and challenges come when we get those two roles reversed.

How often in life do we face a challenge that seems like a winding mountain path? These challenges can take the form of illness, job loss or insecurity, broken relationships, or financial struggles. In these times of struggle, we find it easy to seek the advice of the experts, research the best strategy or treatment, and to rely upon our own senses to inform our decisions. The word here gives a clear direction that we are to acknowledge God at the fork in the road and to seek God's direction.

These verses have become a powerful reminder for me during the past several months. Every day has been filled with new adventures taking me on new paths. These paths, while busy and at times challenging, have been good paths. Our time together will no doubt be an adventure. Trust in the LORD. We can do that.

These truths speak to the path of this new time in the life of Salem as well. As we travel together along this path, may we also hear the reminders of these verses to trust in the LORD.

The Anatomy of Peace – Part 3 Collusion and the Pattern of Conflict

A third core message from the book "The Anatomy of Peace" is the concept that our perceptions and the way we respond to them can actually cause us to draw out of others the conflict and behaviors we claim to dislike.

Collusion is a conflict where the parties are inviting the very things they are fighting against. This happens because every person brings a lifetimes of experiences and perspectives to every situation. They see the actions of another person from this

perspective, and, right or wrong,

their feelings are influenced by their perception. They respond to the other person based on these feelings. This can cause the original person to respond in kind, which reinforces the opinion of the first person, and so the cycle continues.

Breaking the cycle is not easy, but it starts with one person seeing the other person as a person. When one person can desire a positive relationship, and care more about the other person than about the specific task or action, the cycle can stop.

However, at times, even if the second person does not respond to negativity with a negative response, the person who was anticipating a negative response often finds it difficult to respond positively in a situation like this. They may continue to comment negatively, leaving the positive person feeling rejected or frustrated. "Impossible to please"

is a comment that bubbles up in situations like this.

The warning the book highlights is that we need to be keenly aware of our anticipations. Are we judging people based on their previous actions, or on the present situation we are encountering at this moment? As our congregations look toward the future, it is especially important that we remember to evaluate each situation based on its present value, and that we do our absolute best to value every person and every relationship.

Together we can make peace a stronger reality – one thought, one heart and one interaction at a time!
